The Pastor's Pen....

My thanks to all who prepared for, and assisted with, the successful and happy First Communion celebrations at all Masses last weekend. Praying for the children and families that celebrated with the Parish the reception of such a great gift and welcome visitor, Jesus Christ, and with hope that what was celebrated will continue for the children and Parish community with the ongoing support of their families.

We now enter the Sundays of Ordinary Time for the next twenty weeks, having left the Easter Season and the four great Solemnities of the Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity and Corpus Christi. We will travel this journey with Jesus and each other, our Church, until the weekend of 23/24 November, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Advent this year falls on the 30/11-1/12 which will then usher in a new Christian year for us.

Taking up this idea of journeying together we hear St. Luke (9:51) tell us that Jesus resolutely took the road to Jerusalem with His disciples. A turning point had been reached. The ministry in Galilee was over and the focus now was placed on the long and steady walk to the Capital and centre where Jesus would face-off with evil and the powers that keep us enslaved. The word 'resolutely' tells us that Jesus sensed that this was going to be a hard and costly battle, a demanding journey and difficult trial to be gone through, until God had accomplished what needed to be done for us and for the salvation of the world.



With Him on this journey were the twelve disciples, along with an unknown number of other people who came and went from the company of Jesus. It's important that we understand that many people attached themselves to Jesus and His mission and message during the years of His public ministry. Some stayed the distance while many lasted only a little while before going off in their own directions.

To make this Southward journey Jesus chose to traverse the Samaritan lands between Northern Galilee and Jerusalem. The messengers He sent out to prepare for His arrival weren't welcomed by a Samaritan village. James and John wanted to show how powerful they thought they were by calling down fire to destroy that particular settlement, but Jesus wasn't having any such vengeance wrought in His or in God's name. Next, we hear of the encounter Jesus had with three people wanting to join Him on the journey. To the first Jesus made it plain that following Him would mean a life of constant change and uncertainty, without the stability of home and hearth. The second was told that nothing could be placed before the proclamation of the Good-News of the immanent coming of God's Kingdom of life, while the third found out that once setting out with Jesus a single minded focus would be needed which was to be above all other considerations.

These are tough teachings and hard demands. They are trying to let us know both the urgency and the costs of walking with the Lord and in His footsteps. Yes, there are many happy and easy times of sharing and joy, but this is a 'resolute' journey nevertheless. It leads to a confrontation between evil and lies and the power of God's truth and self-sacrificing love. As I have said; there are times on our own journey of faith through life when we have to stand up and be counted for our beliefs and convictions, or we will end by standing up for everything and be counted for nothing!

The Sacraments, especially our regular and faithful participation in and reception of the Eucharist within our Parish community, feeds, deepens and strengthens our union with Jesus for these hard 'standing up' times. Make sure that you decide to do all that you possibly can to stick by the Eucharist and by our Parish community so that when it's your time to stand up and be counted, the strength and power of the Lord will stick by you, giving you courage, wisdom and peace.

" May this divine sacrifice we have offered and received fill us with life, O Lord, we pray, so that, bound to you in lasting charity, we may bear fruit that lasts forever."

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday: falls next weekend on Sunday 7 July 2019 and is a significant celebration in our Church's calendar. Whilst providing us with an opportunity to acknowledge our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander brothers and sisters, the celebration also signifies that we are united as one in God's love and care. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics number over 130,000 and are a growing demographic in our Church today. We must continue to reach out and provide opportunities where we may be enriched and nourished by their deep spirituality, culture and love for Jesus Christ, by opening the doors to our hearts and our homes.

In the Gospel next weekend Jesus says "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Just as Jesus did, we must meet people where they are and walk alongside our First Nation's peoples on their journey to reconciliation and justice.

As Catholics we can set an example for the rest of Australia to follow by coming together as equals and friends in our Schools, Parishes and Organisations in the name of Jesus Christ and in the spirit of mutual respect and unity as one people.

In our parish we will be installing Acknowledgment plaques at the main entrances of both churches and at the parish office. The erection of a plaque in a Parish, is a symbol of welcome for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and an Acknowledgment that there is an understanding of Australia's past. This practice of inclusion forms an important part of rebuilding the relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and non Indigenous Australians. The NATSICC plaque is endorsed by the Australian Catholic Bishops for use in Schools, Parishes and Organisations. The plaque features artwork designed by the Murri Ministry team in Brisbane, and depicts Reconciliation and togetherness in Christ.

Peter's Pence Collection: will be taken up as a retiring collection across the Archdiocese at next weekend's Masses on 6th / 7th July. Peter's Pence gives Catholics in Australia an opportunity to join in communion with the Catholic faithful throughout the world in support of the charitable works of the Holy See. The Collection allows the Holy Father to respond to the most needy throughout the world, to offer timely, effective emergency assistance to our suffering brothers and sisters. 

LITURGY SNIPPET: Ordinary Time – Not So Ordinary

The liturgical season of Easter Time concluded with Pentecost Sunday, and the season of Ordinary Time recommenced on the following Monday. While we have celebrated the solemnities of the Most Holy Trinity and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ on the last two Sundays, this Sunday is the first opportunity for us to resume the familiar and settled patterns of our liturgical prayer.

This is the time of the Church year that does not require any great energy in preparation or celebration – just the ordinary commitment by all the faithful to enter into the liturgy with 'full, conscious and active participation'. Ordinary Time enables us to devote ourselves to exploring the mystery of Christ in all its aspects and to celebrate the presence of God in the ordinary patterns of human life.
