The Pastor's Pen

Our new year of Ordinary Time weeks starts exactly where it should with readings from the Old Testament and St. John's Gospel speaking to us about God's call. We can make a couple of mistakes here, thinking to ourselves that God only called people in the long ago past and that such calls were always mysterious, odd, even mystical in nature and content.

Samuel's call was certainly a little odd, but not terribly mysterious or mystical at all. He was a young boy living at the ancient Bethel shrine under the care of the old priest of God named Eli. This was before there was ever a capital called Jerusalem, or a King to rule over the God's people. Samuel heard a voice calling out to him during the night. Naturally enough he thought it was Eli calling, asking for help of some kind. When Eli realised that this was God calling he told Samuel what to do and say, should such a voice be heard again. Samuel followed Eli's advice responding trustfully to the Lord, growing up to be full of God's spirit and becoming a great prophetic spokesperson for God. It was Samuel who would warn the people against having any king other than God, and who would obey God in allowing the people have their way, anointing both Saul and David as Kings in their turn.

Our Church chooses to give us John's version of the call of the first disciples. Two of them are disciples of John the Baptist who happen to see Jesus walking by the lakeside. John points Him out to them saying that He is the Lamb of God, the one who will be sacrificed so as to save God's people. They simply ask Jesus where he lives? He invites them to come and see, which they do. After a day in His company one of them, Andrew, goes to his brother about 4.00pm and tells him that he believes they've found the Messiah, the anointed and chosen One of God, taking Peter to meet Jesus. Upon seeing him Jesus declares that Simon Peter is to be known as 'Cephas' the 'rock'. This is all play on words since Petros in Greek/Peter in English, means rock or stone, which is Cephas in Aramaic.

This call, too, is neither mystical nor odd, though it is a bit mysterious, with John the Baptist calling out the true identity of Jesus to his followers. It flows naturally enough from spending time with Jesus, and with one brother going to get another keen to share the good news and introduce him to the Lord.

We are called today, and often during the day, to prayer and to Church life and ministry, to Christian moral and honest living, to doing the right and the hard thing because it is right, to fidelity to our vocations and relationships whatever that may be for us. These invitations happen naturally enough for us but they are no less the call of God than was Samuel's, Andrew's or Peter's call. They are always a call to a closer walk with Jesus through the challenges of living, and invitations to respond rightly, openly, freely and trustfully to the Holy Spirit as it makes itself manifest in the people and events of our days and nights.

God's call, however it may come, and through whomever, is the start point of our Christian lives and action with God in and for the world's salvation. Let's listen out for and heed these everyday calls as did Samuel, Andrew, Peter and so many others for they are the way to life in Christ for us.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Enrolments 2018: This faith formation program for young children is an amazingly powerful way to allow children as young as three to encounter God and fall deeply in love with God. The specially prepared environment (atrium) is filled with many beautiful sensorial materials based on the Scriptures and the Liturgy. Founded on the principles of Maria Montessori it meets the deepest religious hungers of children at three different age levels. Level One is for children 3-6 years of age. Level Two is for children 6-9 years of age and Level Three is for children 9-12 years of age. Children come for two hours per week during the school term. Sacraments of Initiation for Children: In the year children turn eight (Year Three), they can be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation administered by the Bishop or his delegate. In the year when children turn nine (Year Four), they are welcomed to the Lord's Table and receive Holy Communion for the first time. **A parent information night will be held at 7pm on Thursday 22nd February at Christ the King Church.** To enroll, children should be baptised and have turned 8 years of age by January 1, 2018. 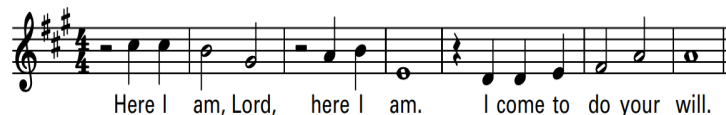
