THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD



The Ascension: is not the celebration of a physical journey into the skies or the clouds, even though religious art often portrays this event in that way. The celebration of the Ascension of the Lord developed in the early Church to mark the fact that there was a period when Jesus of Nazareth was physically present and a subsequent period when he was no longer present in the same way. Heaven is often portrayed as a 'place' in the skies but this can diminish the Christian understanding of heaven.

Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfilment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness ... This mystery of blessed communion with God and all who are in Christ is beyond all understanding and description. (CCC, §1024, §1027)



Heaven is fully participating in the life of God. It is our ultimate destiny. St Augustine said, 'Our lives are restless until they find rest in God'.

The central point to this week's Gospel is the instruction which Jesus gives to the disciples to continue his work and mission: to take the good news of the Gospel to the whole world and to all creation. He warns that this task may not be easy and that some will reject the message the disciples bring, but for those who do accept it the rewards will be great. They will overcome all that impedes or threatens life and will be given great gifts. In the preaching of the Gospel, Jesus is still present and working with them. The disciples unquestioningly carry out the instructions they are given. The preaching and the sacramental life of the Christian Church is the continuation of the presence of Jesus in the world.

Happy Mother's Day: Thank God for mothers. Thank you mother's for the love of God that you live in our lives. Thank you to mothers for your nurturing presence, gracious guidance, warmth and affection. Everyday we rejoice in the gift of our mothers, and it is good for us to especially highlight the treasure that they are to us this day. For those whose mothers have died, it is for us to appreciate the changed, though enduring presence, they have with us in the resurrection. And we pray for expectant mothers and what is about to be brought to birth in their lives, and the lives of their families. God bless them!

Holy God, you compare your own love for your people to the love of a mother for her children. Look with kindness on these mothers, give them comfort in moments of sorrow, and joy in their work for their families. Listen to their prayers, and bless them in all they do for you. Let them share with Jesus your Son and Mary our Mother in the everlasting happiness of heaven. Father, we ask this grace through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. **The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference:** has elected Archbishop Mark Coleridge of Brisbane as president of the Conference. Archbishop Mark was ordained Auxiliary Bishop of Melbourne in 2002 and later became Archbishop of Canberra-Goulburn. Since 2012, he has served as Archbishop of Brisbane. "With few illusions about myself or the task that awaits, I humbly accept the call to serve as president of the Conference at a time that is clearly challenging," Archbishop Mark said. "Among other issues, we bishops will together have to address the recommendations of the Royal Commission and prepare for the upcoming Plenary Council 2020. I trust I will be able to provide the unifying leadership this will require." "Pope Francis is showing the way for bishops conferences around the world, and I look to his leadership to guide and inspire mine in Australia."

Archbishop Mark, took up the new position on May 10, paid tribute to Archbishop Denis Hart, who completed six years serving as president of the Conference. "With his courtesy and efficiency, Archbishop Hart has made a unique contribution as president of the Conference since 2012," Archbishop Mark said.

Archbishop of Sydney Anthony Fisher OP was elected vice-president of the Bishops Conference. The more than 40 members of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference have been meeting in Sydney at their biannual plenary meeting. *Sourced from ACBC Media Blog.*

New advisory body to monitor Catholic reforms in response to child sexual abuse tragedy: The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and Catholic Religious Australia have established a new advisory group that will play a crucial role in influencing and monitoring the Catholic Church's ongoing response to the child sexual abuse scandal. The new Implementation Advisory Group will monitor the response to the findings and recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Response to Child Sexual Abuse and the recommendations of the Truth, Justice and Healing Council, which led the Church's engagement with the Royal Commission. "The task of the Implementation Advisory Group is to be propositional as to the necessary reforms that Catholic institutions and communities will have to implement to be places of safety and transparency and places where we authentically live out our commitment to the values and vision of the Gospels" said Sr Ruth Durick OSU, president of Catholic Religious Australia

Three key groups will take forward the work arising from the Royal Commission and the work led by the Truth Justice and Healing Council:

- Catholic Professional Standards Ltd (CPSL), which was established in 2016 as an independent not-for-profit company limited by guarantee, with a board of directors comprised of lay men and women. Its role includes establishing national safeguarding standards that provide a framework for all Catholic entities to build child-safe cultures;
- A National Redress Reference Group, working with the Commonwealth Government to bring about the establishment of the National Redress Scheme; and
- The Implementation Advisory Group. The program of work the Implementation Advisory Group has identified includes:
 - Relationship with and spiritual support of survivors;
 - Governance and Church culture;
 - Child-focused standards;
 - National Redress Scheme;
 - Seal of confessional and mandatory reporting;
 - Handling of abuse complaints.

New Feast: Our Lady, Mother of the Church:

A new memorial has been introduced to the General Roman Calendar: the commemoration of Mary, Mother of the Church. It will be celebrated not on a fixed date but on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday using texts which are already in the Missal under Votive Masses. There is a proper Preface.

The Second Vatican Council insisted that its treatment of the Virgin Mary should be placed within its document on the Church, giving our theology of Mary a profound ecclesiological significance. Placing the new memorial beside the feast of Pentecost recalls the presence of Mary with the apostles in Pentecost day and her motherly care of the new-born Church. The commemoration further reminds us that by water and the Spirit we are part of the Body of Christ whose Mother is Mary.

Celebrating Mary, Mother of the Church focusses our veneration of Mary in the broader context of the mystery of Christ and the Church. *Sourced from Liturgy News March 2018*




