Pentecost: Eastertide ends with the glorious Solemnity of Pentecost. In the liturgy of recent weeks, and especially with the Ascension, we, the disciples of Jesus, have been promised the gift of the Holy Spirit and his power.

The First Reading, which we hear each year, is a dramatic account of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and of its wondrous effects. Today we celebrate the birth of the Church.

The Psalm is a hymn of praise to the Creator, and a prayer that God will fill us, the Church and the whole world, with God's Spirit.

In the Second Reading, St Paul clearly distinguishes the difference between a life guided by the Spirit and that led by self-indulgence. We are encouraged to lead a Spirit-filled life, following Christ's example and manifesting his gifts.

The Gospel takes us back to Jesus' words at the Last Supper, and Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit, who is our Advocate, our teacher, and our memory. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of truth who will lead us to the complete truth, and is a witness to Christ. We too share in this witness.

As we celebrate this climax of Eastertide, spend time this week pondering what these last fifty days have meant to you.

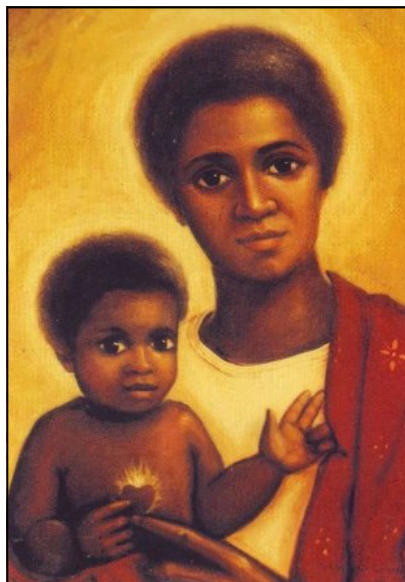
Plenary Council 2020: This year as we celebrate Pentecost the Australian Church will also officially launch the journey of the Plenary Council. The journey really began back in May 2016 when the bishops decided to move towards the Council, and now after two years of preparation we are in a position to have a more formal launch.

It is essential that the Plenary Council be seen not as administrative or political but as spiritual and ecclesial. The decision was made by the bishops but under the influence of the Holy Spirit; and the Holy Spirit will have to be our guide at every step of the journey. We are drawn into a process of discernment of what God is asking of us in Australia at this time, and that process will demand deep and constant prayer – a listening to God – from the entire Catholic community.

The Church was born of the Spirit at Pentecost, and we are now in search of a new birth as we look to the future. Birth can be painful and messy, but if this process is the work of the Holy Spirit it will lead to peace and hope and joy.

Beyond this Pentecost launch, we are urged to enter wholeheartedly into the consultation process which now begins, so that as many voices as possible can be heard as we seek to shape the Plenary Council agenda.

Plenary Council *continued* The journey of the Council has three phases: preparation, celebration and implementation. The preparation phase has already begun; the Council will be celebrated in two sessions, one in October 2020 and the other is early 2021; and the implementation phase will stretch far beyond that.

In the Archdiocese a Plenary Council Task Force has been convened, who will promote and coordinate all our efforts at the local level and who will work closely with the national Plenary Council Executive Committee. Each bishop has also been asked to name two people to be part of a national network of local representatives. *Sourced from correspondence from Archbishop Coleridge*

Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians: is celebrated on Thursday 24th May. "The Virgin Mary has been invoked in times of religious strife under the title of Help of Christians. In thanksgiving for the release of Pope Pius VII from captivity in 1814, the feast was established the following year on the anniversary of his restoration. The first Australian provincial synod held in Sydney in 1844 placed the Church of Australia under Mary's patronage invoked by the title Help of Christians. The solemn feast is an occasion to seek Mary's help and protection for our Church and nation." *Daily Mass Book 2017*. Almighty ever-living God, who placed the love of Our Lady, Help of Christians in the hearts of those who brought the Catholic faith to these shores, grant, through her intercession, wisdom for our leaders and integrity to our citizens, so that, under her protection, Australia may know harmony, justice and peace. *Collect*. A Liturgy of the Word with Communion will be held at St Joseph's Church Thursday 24th May at 9am.

Feast of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart: will be celebrated next Saturday 26th May with Mass at 10.30am at St Joseph's Church Corinda. The Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart were founded in Issoudun, France in 1874. Five OLSH Sisters arrived in Botany Bay in 1885, spreading their apostolate the following year to Thursday Island and beyond! Locally, the Sisters arrived at Corinda in 1917 to establish St Joseph's School. We are grateful for the ministry of the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in our parish over the past 101 years, and rejoice with them on their feast day. Mass will be celebrated by Fr Gerry Kalinowski and will include a Dedication of Children to Our Lady of the Sacred Heart. All are welcome. A "high morning tea" will follow Mass. May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be Everywhere Loved ~ Forever! Our Lady of the Sacred Heart ~ pray for us!



St Vincent de Paul Festival and Expo: A group of 46 gathered at the Parish Centre Graceville on Sunday 6th May to explore the nature of the society and its works, both locally and on a broader scale. The theme was "Giving and Receiving". Sr Mel Dwyer, who is Spiritual Adviser to the Queensland Branch of the society, began by exploring the gift of presence, the way in which we affirm the value of those we visit. A number of local Vincentians then shared thoughts on what membership meant to them, and small groups then reflected on benefits for givers and receivers.
