The Pastor's Pen....

This weekend is our **Deanery Annual Catholic Mission Appeal**. I ask you to welcome warmly and listen to our Missions guest speaker, Emily Connors, who will tell us about the work of Catholic Missions across Australia and the world and how our prayers, donations and friendship with Catholic Mission makes a great contribution to the betterment of the lives and futures of so many.



As it has turned out Mark's Gospel reading is perfect for thinking about missions and our own call to mission and evangelise people we contact every day. Jesus got His followers (the Twelve) together, instructed them about what to say and do, and then sent them out in pairs to visit towns and villages preaching, healing and helping set people free. His work became their ministry. In His Spirit and with His authority they could reach more people than could Jesus by Himself.

No matter how much or how little society and cultures might change over time and from place to place the mission we have remains essentially the same; to say and do for others as Jesus did and still does for us, and to do it all in His Spirit and Name, and for the greater glory of God.

The Second Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians is a mighty text full of great richness, too much to unpack here in these few lines. It deserves your reading (and re-reading at home) and your thought and prayer. In just eleven packed verses Paul outlines for us the entire theology of our salvation in and through Christ, from before the creation of the universe through to its final summation and the end of history.

As Paul understands reality everything is an act of God's grace, the free and unmerited gift of God's love poured out upon us so that we can be set free and find our way into living as we were intended, living today in our unique way with the dignity of God's sons and daughters. Because we have made bad choices, selfish and unloving choices, Christ came to us to love us back into life, paying for this by freely, lovingly and totally giving Himself up for us and for our liberty. We were prisoners to sin, unfree. He has released us from this slavery, this jail, so that we can now live every day in God's forgiving mercy. God's plan isn't a secret anymore. It is this; that all peoples and all things would come into unity and right balance and relationship, in Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit is working slowly and steadily with us in helping this plan to unfold. We who have faith and hope in Jesus Christ and in His good news open ourselves to His Spirit, working with God so that God's plan of unity, justice, love and peace might progress and be fulfilled. When we live our lives in a way that is worthy of God's chosen children, helping others in some small measure to do so themselves, we are co-operating with God's grace, promoting and furthering the Reign of God in our world. This is our Baptismal mission, our call to action here and now in this place and time in which we find ourselves. As I said earlier, do yourself a favour; take your time with this text over the week ahead. It's very rich, instructive and full of hope and promise as only Good-News can be.

Finally, I draw your attention once again to the upcoming important events we have planned for our entire Parish Community. Mark them in your diary now, and be sure that you participate as fully as you can.

Plenary Council 2020: Listen to what the Spirit is saying... Why are we having a Plenary Council in 2020? There are many reasons for having a Plenary Council for the Catholic Church in Australia: Pope Francis has invited the local church to dialogue; the contemporary society of Australia has changed significantly, and the Royal Commission into Institutional Response to Child Sexual Abuse has been a significant and influential event that requires deep consideration and response.

When the Australian Catholic Bishops announced the decision to hold a Plenary Council, Brisbane Archbishop Mark Coleridge said that "the Church is not the presence in our society it once was. We need to take a measure of that and make decisions accordingly. The culture in which we have to proclaim the Gospel is very different to what it was even 20 or 30 years ago."

Scripture Reflection Groups: One of the responses from Corinda Graceville Parish to the Plenary Council is to encourage and request commitment from as many parishioners as possible to read and reflect upon daily Scripture readings. The goal is to develop one's personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour. It should also have the same effect of improving relationships with our fellow parishioners and many others we come into contact with in our work and social environment. A tried and successful system to be used in doing this is called the S.O.A.P. system:

- S. Scripture - Write down a sentence or word that speaks to you.
- O. Observation - What is the message here for you.
- A. Application - How can you apply this message in your life.
- P. Prayer - Formulate your prayer and write it down.

It is strongly recommended to meet with others either weekly or fortnightly in a small group to share these reflections. Bill Seymour has offered to lead a small team tasked with the responsibility of recording your interest, who is in each small group, and where and when you meet. Please express you interest/commitment to the parish office and Bill will get in touch with you.
