*The Pastor's Pen....*

This current Church Liturgical Calendar year ends with the Solemnity of Christ the King on the weekend of 24th/25th November. Our new year, guided mainly by St. Luke's Gospel, begins with the 1st Sunday of Advent which this year falls on the weekend 1st/2nd December, Christmas being the evening of Monday 24th through Tuesday 25th December. This means our secular New Year's Day for 2019 will be on a Tuesday, honouring Mary, the Mother of God and World Day of Prayer for Peace.

With this 'heads-up' in our minds the focus of Jesus in St. Mark's Gospel for this weekend is on the Great Commandment. The commandment to love God with all we are and have is taken from the Book of Deuteronomy 6:4-5 which is part of our First Reading. The commandment that we love our neighbour as ourselves comes from the Book of Leviticus 18:19. This tells us that the people had these two commandments but few, seemingly, had made the connection and practical integration of them. Much the same holds true today. Some are all about the love and service of God, downgrading if not completely neglecting the love and service we owe to each other. Meanwhile, other people are all focused on serving, loving and helping others, downgrading, even neglecting, to love and honour God.

The wisdom and genius of Jesus in both His teaching and in His practice was to bring these two essential commandments together making them utterly dependent on each other. Jesus saw that those who have a lot of time and energy for God, but then go on to ignore, misuse and mistreat other people, are entering the territory of hypocrisy. He also saw that people who have all their goodness and care for other people but aren't basing their lives in the Divine are at grave risk of burning out and turning all of their loving into an ego trip that makes them feel better and superior to the very people they are trying to assist and lift up.

When Jesus answered that Scribe, a learned man educated in the laws of his day, the Scribe praised Jesus' answer echoing it back for its completeness. The Scribe, too, understood that both parts, that of love of God and of others, must hang together to be complete, sustainable and free from hypocrisy and the selfish ego.

Of course, love is a verb, an act, better written in the English language as 'loving'. It's a deed we undertake and a commitment we enact freely and generously. We are to be always loving God, showing this in our loving service of our fellow men and women, especially those in the greatest need and crisis. Our loving of others has to be rooted in the first love we experience, namely God's eternal loving of us, so that we can go on loving others into life just as God loves us and our Universe into life each and every day.

If, or more honestly, when these two parts of the one Great Commandment get sundered apart, trouble, separation from the Truth, selfishness and sin await us. Keeping these two parts together as one means, as Jesus said to the Scribe, that we are not far from the meaningful truth and living out of the Kingdom of Heaven which the Lord came to announce and commence amongst us.

**Ministry Volunteers Open Invitation:** to members of the Parish community to join the Ministry Volunteer Program. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact the Parish Office, Fr Mark or Malia Mar. The Parish will then arrange for you to enter into the required training program, complete all necessary paperwork and include you in a regular roster. *The Archdiocese of Brisbane has standards of conduct for employees and volunteers to maintain a safe and healthy environment. Our commitment to these standards requires that we conduct background referencing for all persons who will engage in direct and regular involvement with children, young people and/or vulnerable adults.*

**Altar Servers:** We are always in need of more Altar Servers to assist at the weekend Masses. In particular, there is a need for new Altar Servers at Christ the King, for both the morning and evening Masses. To be an Altar Server, each child needs to have made their First Holy Communion. Training will be provided, and a mentor will help younger children until they are confident. Parents can contact the Parish Office or speak to Malia Mar. Or, at Graceville Masses please speak to Michael Greene or Leonie Gauld, and at Corinda Masses you can speak to Chris or Ian Larter.

**Safeguarding Volunteer Data Forms:** There have been many changes since the Archdiocese began its Safeguarding journey in 2014, and this has at times put a strain on parish time and resources. However, this year there has been a focus on sharing the load between the parishes and the Archdiocesan administration services. All volunteer paperwork across the Archdiocese is now being sent to the Volunteering section of the Archdiocesan Department of People and Culture (the old HR department). Also past forms are being scanned and sent in.

*What data are they collecting?* The P&C department are collecting from your forms your name, address, date of birth and the role you carry out in the parish. If the ministry in which you serve requires Blue Cards, police checks, Safeguarding training, etc., they will also collect that information. After entering your data, they then destroy the forms.

*What is the data used for?* The data collected is used to ensure that all volunteers working in the Archdiocese have had the appropriate checks completed for their ministry. The database, in which the information is held, has been programmed to send a monthly report to each parish, listing all volunteers and expiry dates of background checks etc for that parish. This report is then updated and acted upon by the parish and returned to the Archdiocese, saving the Parish Safeguarding Representative hours of administrative work. Instead those hours can be used interacting with the different ministries, ensuring the Safeguarding Policy is followed, or working to set up new ministries that are founded on safe people, safe spaces and safe activities.

Centralising the volunteering data is just one of the strategies the Archdiocese uses to safeguard children and vulnerable adults. In itself it will not stop the morally weak from attempting to access our parish in order to commit abuse, but together with all our other strategies, it will make it much harder for them to do so. And the harder it is for them, the safer our community is.
