The Pastor's Pen....

The centenary of the Armistice (11/11/1918-2018) this weekend calls on all of us to remember those men and women, young and old, military and civilian from across the world who gave their all, even the ultimate sacrifice of their lives, so that we can be here today having the choices and options that we do, living the way we choose in relative peace and security.

It has to be acknowledged as historical fact that no other country on a per capita basis lost so many men in the First World War as did Australia. Entire communities were devastated by this awful loss of life and future potential, families were rendered asunder never to recover, and a whole generation of women were left as widows or spinsters.

How awful that less than 21 years later the world should be at war again beginning in the September of 1939. The Second World War came even closer to our shores with the Empire of Japan occupying New Guinea, bombing Timor, Darwin, and other places here in Australia and even sending mini-Submarines into Sydney Harbour. I grew up on the Fraser Coast and it was there and on Fraser Island that Z-Force trained for their various secret operations against the Japanese Imperial Forces, made legendary in films. In terms of the First World War a Maryborough man named Duncan Chapman is acknowledged as the first man ashore at Gallipoli on 25 April 1915. He survived the Dardanelles Campaign, flawed in its planning as it was, only to die on his first day in action on the French Western Front in 1916.

This is simply to say that every community suffered loss, endured anxiety and bore grief as the thousands of monuments across our land attest. This day and especially this year's centenary doesn't glorify war in any manner. Rather, it remembers the peace when it was finally achieved, recalling those who fought, suffered and died for us so that we can live as we do and enjoy what we have. Remembrance Day also asks us to think about those who have fought in so many other conflicts across the globe in the last 100 years as well as those who do so today, and the men and women who stand ready on our behalf to do so tomorrow if called upon. We must not forget lest we repeat the errors of the past. We pray and pledge ourselves to work tirelessly for peace and harmony amongst peoples so that their sacrifice helps to save us from the miseries of war. 'Lest we Forget.'

The Gospel story of the widow's mite (her small coin donation) is unexpectedly appropriate. She hadn't much to give to God, but she gave all she had. This was far more than those who gave a lot while keeping the bulk in reserve for themselves. Jesus noticed her total sacrifice and praised it greatly to His disciples. Her sacrificial act of generosity showed clearly that she truly loved God with all of her heart, mind, soul and strength, the first part of the Great Commandment we listened to last weekend. It also showed that she loved her neighbour as herself (the second part of the Commandment) because her contribution to the Temple Treasury of all that she had to live on was meant to go to the aid of the poor and needy. Her gift was for God's glory and the assistance of others in their need.

In its purest form living the loving life is always sacrificial, putting the well being of others before our own wishes and desires. Jesus did this, as did the poor widow in her own way. Spouses and parents do this, too, all of the time, as do other family members. So, too, do many of our Emergency workers, Clergy and Vowed Religious men and women, and many other people in various relationships and occupations. In terms of this weekend's centenary, those who went to and still do go to war on our behalf also did and do this still, risking mind and body, life and limb for us and others unnamed and unknown.

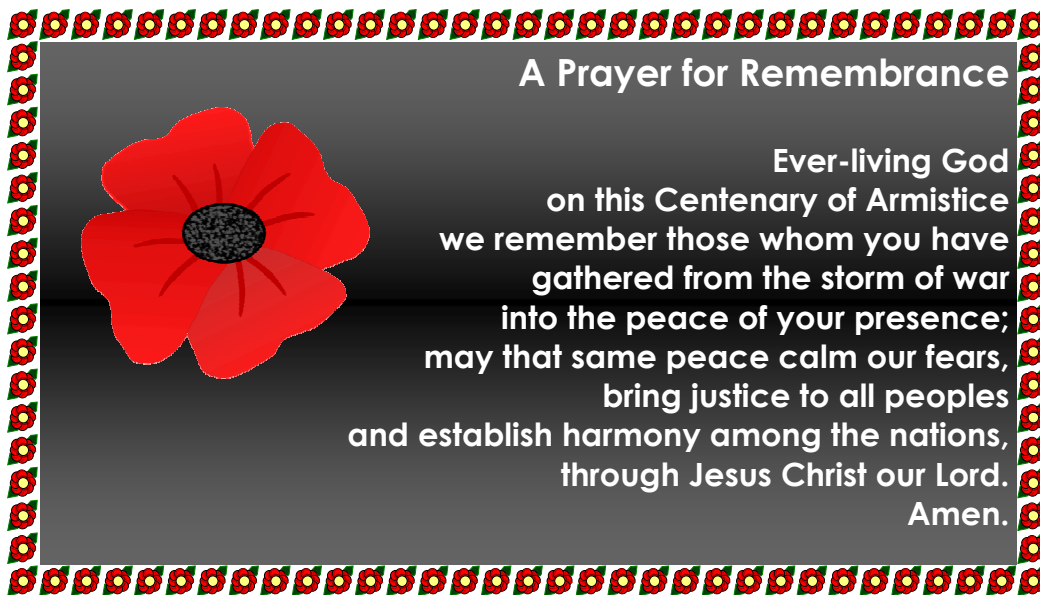
As we remember all of this and all of these people, past and present, I point you to the words of the Gospel Acclamation; Happy the poor in spirit; the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs!

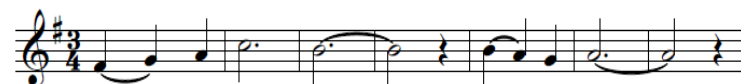
