

*The Pastor's Pen....*

The Sea of Galilee is sometimes called the Lake/Sea of Tiberius, and here in Luke's Gospel the Lake of Gennesaret. Different names for the same heart shaped body of fresh water found in Galilee. It's source is the Jordan River which begins its life in Lebanon flowing from the snows of the mountains there. Downhill, into a deep depression, these clear mountain waters run filling the lake, then onwards and south along the Jordan valley following the land as it sinks deeper into the lowest point, the Dead Sea. From this Dead Sea nothing ever escapes.

Everything, then and now, depends upon these life-giving waters as did the fishermen Simon (Peter), James, John, Andrew and others. After the messy and angry rejection Jesus received in Nazareth, He went to the lakeside village of Capernaum, healing people in the Synagogue there. According to Luke, one of the people healed was Simon's mother in law. Next followed a tour of the towns and synagogues of Judaea wherein Jesus proclaimed the coming of God's Kingdom healing many people. At this early stage, as St. Luke tells us the story, Jesus was acting alone as a travelling healer and preacher. It's as if Jesus was testing the waters to see how His message and mission was received while building up contacts and public credibility.

Only after this tour did Jesus return to Galilee and the Lakeside. Getting into Simon's boat near Capernaum He taught the crowds before calling him and a few other fishermen to follow Him. Thus began the discipleship adventure of capturing the hearts and minds of other people. Simon said that he wasn't worthy of such a call, but who ever is? In the Second Reading St. Paul says as much about himself when he was called to be an Apostle of the Risen Lord. Isaiah, too, protested that he was too unclean to respond to God's call to be a Prophet. Nevertheless, all of these people did follow God's call and we read about them and remember them to this day.



In John's Gospel 15:16 we read these words addressed by Jesus to His disciples; 'You did not choose me, no, I chose you to go out and bear fruit that will last'. I believe that we all need to hear this statement often when trying to do our best in carrying on with our call in life; in our families and relationships, in our work and daily tasks, in our study and recreation, in our ministry and vocation, and above all in our call to be Christ and to bring Christ to all of these diverse situations and different people.

Nothing we can say or do will ever make us worthy of our call, only God's grace and mercy can do that. Alone, as Jesus learnt on His solo tour through Galilee and Judaea, we're limited, but with others working along side of us, something like fellow fishermen working as a team in a boat, we can be fruitful, not futile, hauling in the catch God provides. How dreary our lives would be without this direction? How chaotic without this call? And how grim would living be without God's grace? The direction, call and grace is always there for us. What we have to be is attuned to the sound of it, and ready to respond with all of our souls.


