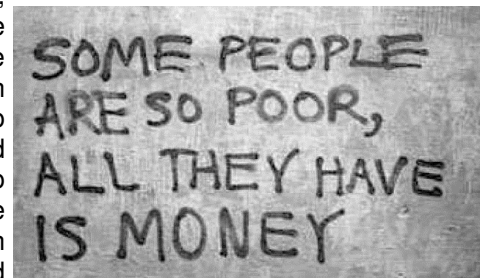

The Pastor's Pen....

We'd be wrong to hear and interpret today's First Reading and Gospel as an attack on capitalism, a philosophy and economic system that was completely unknown to both the author of Ecclesiastes and to Jesus Himself. These two readings are a warning about the dangers and futility of loving money and material goods. As it says in the Book of Proverbs 'avarice gives rise to selfish and wicked actions' and then in St. Paul's First Letter to Timothy 6:10 where he writes plainly 'the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil'. It's this love of money and material things that the wisdom writer condemns as vanity in the First Reading, and that Jesus warns us about in Luke's Gospel.

Only last weekend when we gathered as the community of God's family to pray the Mass we heard these words prayed for and with us in the Opening Collect; "Grant that with you, merciful and protecting God, as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure." It's getting this balance in our priorities and clarity of vision that Jesus wants and that the Ecclesiastes writer asks us to seek. Furthermore, St. Paul says, in a line in this weekend's Second Reading from his Letter to the Colossians, that we are to focus our thoughts on the things that are in heaven where Christ is and not on the things that are on earth. He adds, that we have to kill the rule over us of passions that belong only to this life, especially greed which is the same as worshipping a false god! It's a plain and as clear as that.

I'm certain we've all met people who love money and possessions above everything and even everyone else. I'm equally sure that, as we go along in this life, we've seen these people struck by illness, misfortune and the inevitable ravages of dying. We may even have witnessed these people coming to realise that what they've loved so much and devoted their lives to having is powerless to save them or hold their hands as they've struggled, suffered and died. It dawned on them, perhaps too late, that what captured their hearts was, indeed, no more than a vanity.



What we are asked to consider once again is where our hearts are focused; on what passes or on what ever endures; on treasures here or on the treasures, values and relationships that make us rich in the sight of God? Only the lasting things and the treasures we may have stored in the sight of God can give us any comfort and security when the chips are down. Along with this we are also being told to use the passing gifts of this world and life wisely and in a way that promotes the well-being of others, of family, friends and strangers, righting some of the inequalities that crop up all the time in our economic system and society.

That we get our values and priorities clearer and more balanced re-igniting our generosity, care for others and respect for this world's limited resources is a timely focus for all of us this weekend and over the week ahead. I'll be joining you in asking our merciful and wise God to help me get my heart focused aright and my values in better alignment with Jesus' word and wisdom. Let me end my sharing with you by saying that Psalm 89, chosen for our response this weekend, is one of my favourites, so listen closely to what it says. It offers, in poetic song form, great insights into our short lives and our utter dependence on God.

Recycling for Vinnies: St Joseph's and Christ the King Schools and St Vincent De Paul Society have joined together to raise funds through the collection of Drinking Bottles and Cans (not milk bottles or large wine bottles). The schools have been supplied with special wheelie bins (with bright green lids) by Can And Bottle Refund Co. at Darra in which to deposit suitable Bottles or Cans. So parents with children at school are encouraged to take their Bottles and Cans to the schools and deposit them in the bins provided. Likewise the Parish have positioned two wheelie bins beside the Tennis Court Shed at Corinda (directly across from the parish car park in Clewley Street), and one behind Christ the King Church (near the shed) so all parishioners are urged to deposit their cans and bottles in these bins. All funds obtained by the parish from this enterprise will be spent by the Corinda Graceville Vinnies Conference to those needy people who live within our Parish boundary. One of our Vinnies members has already arranged with his immediate neighbours to deposit bottles into a container he provides and he delivers them himself to the parish bins. Maybe others could organise a similar arrange with their immediate neighbours? A diagram of suitable bottles for recycling is shown above.

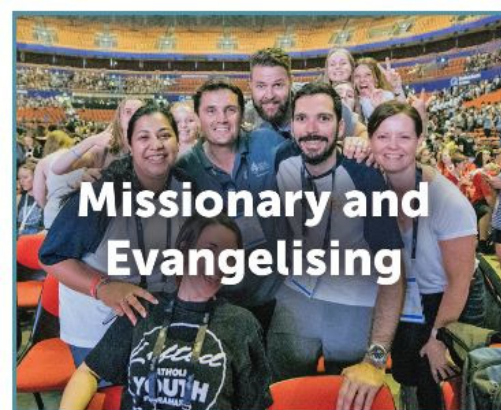

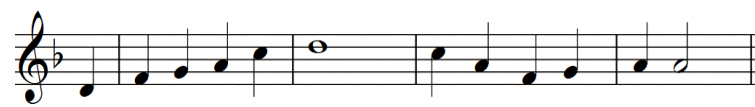
