The Pastor's Ten....

The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, taken from the writings of Sr Patricia Stevenson, a Sister of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart.

Directors who make films are very aware of the power of images in their storytelling. They know that so much more can be conveyed by the careful selection of colour, music and symbol. Jesus as a master storyteller also used images, particularly familiar ones, as a focus of his message. Today he uses salt and light.

Take salt, for example, some of you may remember the crocks of beans where layers of salt kept the vegetables edible into the winter, or the rubbing of salt and spices into pork or fish as a preservative. A little salt, sugar and water has saved the lives of many suffering from dehydration. Some foods need salt to enhance the flavour, although a little too much and the dish is unpalatable.

When Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth," he is calling on his followers to be the positive side of the image and to resist the negative; to be saviours not destroyers. We are called to enhance the lives of others by encouraging their unique flavour, and by preserving and protecting through our presence.

Every person can experience the power of the image, can reflect on what they understand and discover their particular gift for the community.

How does salt lose its taste? By pollution. If salt is contaminated it may as well be thrown out.

To be a disciple means to stay focussed on Gospel life and ministry and not become distracted by things that have no real value.

The second great image is of light. Isaiah speaks of inner light as goodness which comes from living in a Godly manner. Personal devotions, like fasting are good but they do not compare with a change in our attitudes. "Free those who are trapped in harmful situations. Break every habit which keeps people in slavery. Bring nourishment to the hungry. Shelter the homeless, those who feel lost or isolated. Your godliness will shine out like a new day and will bring you healing."

Jesus adds his own flavour to the imagery of light which is used so often in the Scriptures. "You are the light of the world." This is powerful language. We call Jesus the Light of the World - here Jesus says it is we who are the light of the world!

When we are travelling long distances at night it is most comforting to see the lights of a town. The lights say comfort, food, home, safety and companionship - all things that reassure us. We are to be such signs in a dark world. We are to be Christ in our place and in our time.

No wonder Jesus follows this by a reminder about not dodging our commitment. He says, "You don't light a lamp and then put it under a basket." To do this is to dim the light. Jesus is calling for us to be on full power.

The purpose of our Christ-light is to draw others to walk in God's light. All are called to live life according to their potential.

Paul emphasises the need for humility. Our light is powered by the Spirit of Christ. Therefore whatever good we do, is not from our own cleverness; is not for our own glory, but is the result of being open to the glory of God.

Message from the Archbishop re the selection of delegates for the Plenary Council, the first session of which will be celebrated in October this year. There is a unique opportunity for a few clergy and parishioners to participate in this historic Council. The Archdiocese will be sending a delegation of 10-14 people to the Plenary Council. This includes:

Those required by Canon Law: Archbishop Mark Coleridge, Archbishop of Brisbane, Bishop Ken Howell, Auxiliary Bishop, Monsignor Peter Meneely, Vicar General, Fr Dan Ryan, Fr Adrian Farrelly and Fr Adrian Sharp, Episcopal Vicars. Four to eight delegates called from the Archdiocese from the 'presbyters and others of Christ's faithful,' that is: from amongst the clergy and the laity. The delegates to be called should meet the following criteria:

- A demonstrated commitment to leadership in the Church and/or its ministries (e.g. an active parish ministries leader,
 Catholic Education staff member, Catholic Social Services worker or ecclesial movement leader)
- The living of the Gospel in the person's life through both prayer and action
- An awareness of 'the bigger picture' of Catholic witness and work in the context of contemporary Australian society
- Previous participation in / leadership of listening and dialogue, or listening and discernment encounters with people in the person's community, workplace or family.

However, the chief thing to be considered is the person's ability and capacity to discern with an open heart, listening to what the Spirit is saying to the Church in Australia at this time with an eye to the future. Anyone who expresses an interest in being called by the Archdiocese to be a delegate to the Plenary Council would need to be available for the following dates:

- Preparation and formation days for Brisbane delegates Thursday, 25 June 2020 5.00pm Saturday, 27 June 2020 12.00pm
- Plenary Council Assembly 1: Sunday, 4 October 2020 2.00 pm Sunday, 11 October 2020 12.00pm
- Plenary Council Assembly 2: Monday, 28 June 2021 12.00pm Saturday, 3 July 2021 12.00pm

If the delegates are not free for all of those dates, they are ineligible to be called. Note too that the minimum required age for delegates is 16 years. In order to be included in the selection process, expressions of interest should be sent to aomail@bne.catholic.net.au by 12.00pm on Monday, 10 February 2020.

Although the total number of delegates is quite small, this group of people will represent the entire Archdiocese and help to guide the Church in Australia into the future. 
