*The Pastor's Pen....*

Welcome back to the public celebration of the Mass in our Parish. Welcome back inside our Church buildings and to our local community gathered in fellowship and worship.

As you know, Health regulations presently limit our numbers to 20 persons at each Mass and at Baptisms and Weddings, with 50 persons allowed at Funerals. **You must book in for your Mass, be that for weekends or weekdays, through the Parish office via email or phone 3379 1534. We are required to record your contact details, keeping them for eight weeks. We will be complying with all of the costly cleaning demands and physical distancing protocols. Sharing of food/drink is, at this point, sadly not yet possible**

Clearly, these Government health regulations are going to be changing over the weeks and months to come depending upon what emerges with the Covid-19 virus and community infection rates. I am asking you to please be responsible for staying across any changes in numbers and procedures for the worse, or more hopefully for the bigger and the better.

Public Confession (the **Sacrament of Penance**) will be available at St. Joseph's Church each **Saturday afternoon from 4.30-5.00pm**, or at another agreed time by making an appointment with me via the Parish Office. In saying this you **need to note that Saturday evening Mass at St. Joseph's Church has a new starting time, 5.30pm**. This will remain the time throughout the next 3 months of Winter. In late August I'll review how it's gone with you, to keep the 5.30pm time or move it to a different time. All other Mass times stay the same as they've been for many years.

The last public Mass I celebrated in our Parish was the 9.30am Friday Mass at Christ the King Church on 20th March 2020. This means that we've had a Pandemic enforced break of some eleven weekends, which feels like a long time to us. It's worth remembering though that many people, both here and overseas have, and are still having, an even longer suspension of Public worship because of Coronavirus. Moreover, people in Australia and numerous places overseas regularly find that they have to go much longer without the Eucharist and other Sacraments due to their remoteness and/or the shortage of Ordained Clergy to serve them.

My time over these weeks, as it has been for so many of you, has been alone, but mostly not lonely. I've faithfully offered my private Mass for you, the people of this Parish, and for the world. Like me, you've developed new ways to join online worship, to read and pray the God's Word in the scriptures and to find God deep within yourselves and in others, too.

Trusting that our forced eleven week 'absence' and 'fast' has made our hearts grow fonder and hungrier for the Lord and for our community, we begin afresh on this Trinity Sunday. It will be simple Masses that we celebrate with reduced numbers for some time, a small but meaningful 'rising from the ashes' to form the Body of Christ around the Lord at His table of Word and Eucharist. As God the Trinity is a community of love, and as we are all made in this image, so we come together again to model the life of God and the hope of Heaven; one people, one faith and one Lord who is over us all, through all, and living with all of us.

## ST VINCENT DE PAUL WINTER APPEAL

During the pandemic, the St Vincent de Paul conference in this parish has found new and covid-safe ways to provide support to those who need it. At this stage, the increased government support by way of jobseeker and jobkeeper, means that the calls on your local conference have been slightly reduced over the last couple of months of lockdown. Many of our assistance calls are from people on disability pensions, and Carers' Allowances, which have not been increased, yet who have found their grocery bills escalating when the cheaper brands are often not available.

The experts are telling us that the real effect of the downturn in the economy will be felt in the next quarter, when increased allowances are suspended, and people who are newly unemployed have eaten up all their savings. This is when we anticipate that our support locally will be needed more than ever.

Next weekend now appears in our Parish calendar as the date of the St. Vincent de Paul Winter appeal. It is important that we prepare for this time through conducting our appeal without the benefit of our normal Mass attendances. Funds raised in this appeal will be used by your local conference to assist those in need in our area between now and Christmas. With only 20 attendees at each Mass, we need to reach out to you through the newsletter to ask for your help.

We are asking our fellow parishioners to assist us by donating to the appeal in one of three ways:

1. Deposit direct to our bank account, **giving your name as the reference**, to enable us to issue a receipt for this tax-deductible donation. Deposits can be made online or in person at any branch of the Commonwealth Bank.
2. Post your donation to SVDP, P.O Box 97 Corinda 4075 – clearly giving your name and address so we can issue a receipt.
3. Leave your donation at the Parish office – again giving details of name and address.

Of course, in asking you to reach out to us with assistance, we are also conscious that many of our own parishioners are facing difficulties of their own due to changed circumstances. Please be assured that we understand that you may not be able to assist us at this time, and know that **we are available for you** if you need our help.

**Masses will recommence on the weekend of 6th / 7th June. Please note that numbers attending Mass will be limited to 20 people per Mass**, as per the current Government regulations. Social distancing and hygiene protocols will be paramount. We will be required to record names and contact details of all present, for tracing purposes. **You will need to make a reservation to attend any Mass, by phoning the parish office on 3379 1534 or emailing corindagraceville@bne.catholic.net.au**

### **Sacramental Program: Confirmation 2020**

We have devised a schedule of activities and events that fits within the current constraints and takes advantage of existing resources and available technology. We are very fortunate to have access to workbooks and materials that will allow much preparation work to occur at home, which will be complemented with the regular support of online sessions with our Sacramental Program team. We will be discussing each element of this program as part of our Zoom meetings next Wednesday.

Our preparation program will include the following highlights:-

1. Lead in retreat – 'Rite of Illumination' to be offered during the week commencing 20 July
2. 'We Celebrate with Jesus' workbook to be completed at home
3. Concluding retreat and practice session – 4 September
4. Celebration of Sacrament of Confirmation\* - 11 September

\*It is important to note that whilst we are continuing with our preparations we are not currently in a position to guarantee that we can go ahead with the celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation as it is scheduled for Friday, 11 September. We will continue to provide advice regarding this situation as Government and Archdiocese directives become available. However, in principle, it is our intention to continue to support our families in their preparations and in particular to offer celebrations of this Sacrament once permitted.

### **Plenary Council Update:**

The two assemblies for the Plenary Council of Australia will now take place in October 2021 and April 2022, following the disruption of the original schedule due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference decided to postpone the opening assembly by 12 months, with it now to be held in October 2021. Adelaide remains the venue for the first assembly. The second assembly will be in Sydney in April 2022.

"Mindful of the ongoing challenges of COVID-19, it was felt that delaying the first assembly by a full year would provide some certainty that travel and social distancing guidelines will have been lifted for the assembly," said Plenary Council President Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB. "Just as importantly, we believe that period of time will allow for an adequate period of preparation for the delegates and the Catholic community.

"The postponement was an unfortunate speed bump on the Church's path to the Plenary Council assemblies, but we are committed to using this extra time wisely."

Plenary Council facilitator Lana Turvey-Collins said the continuing preparation for the Council will take on some new characteristics, shaped by the experience of the pandemic.

"A program of webinars, podcasts and other multimedia projects will be rolled out in the latter half of 2020 to help the People of God explore and share about how they respond to the Spirit and live out their own call to mission – as individuals and collectively," she said.

"The material will be both formative and dialogical to help parishes, families, workplaces and other Catholic communities and organisations consider the unique contribution they make to the life and mission of the Church."
