*The Pastor's Pen....*

Well friends, I was all set for last weekend, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, with my Pastor's Pen written and homily completed, but it wasn't to be. Sadly, based on what I've read, studied and observed, sudden changes to our Covid 19 protocols and snap lockdowns have to be factored into our thinking and planning for at least the remainder of this year and some would caution even as far as the early months of 2022.

Much depends on our widely embraced uptake of vaccinations (when they become available) and their effectiveness both here and overseas. Like you, I hope we don't have too many more lockdowns, but let's not be unduly upset if we do have a few more to cope with. As for traveling in Australia (to say nothing of overseas) let's bunker down in our own State if we possibly can because traveling locally is safest and least likely to see us stranded.

Masks are mandatory inside (except in our homes) including at Church, and outside when we can't keep more than 1.5 meters apart. Presiding Clergy have to wear a mask into and out of the Church building and when distributing Communion, but not when otherwise leading the Liturgy, praying or preaching, much as you have seen others take off their masks when speaking publicly. All of us being human, let's gently and kindly try to remind each other about this practice. At the time of writing this mandated practice holds until 1.00am on Friday 22nd January. Children under 12 years or persons with a medical reason are legally exempt from having to wear a mask, but if at all possible, wear one.

Moving on now to this weekend, after His baptism and the powerful spiritual affirmation experience Jesus discerned His future for some time. After this He slowly began to invite people to come and be with Him, learning from Him the way of God's Good News.

This weekend in John's Gospel we hear this invitation given to some of those who followed John the Baptist. Jesus invited them to 'Come and see' where He was, stay with Him and become disciples who would learn from Him. One of these was Andrew who the next day went to tell his brother, Simon Peter, bringing him to Jesus. Just as the Baptist had pointed Jesus, the Lamb of God, out to them, so Andrew evangelises by going to, inviting and bringing his brother to the Lord. Using a linguistic play on the name of Peter, Jesus calls him Cephas meaning Rock. Time will reveal what sort of Rock Peter was.

None of the disciples really knew what they were getting into when they first came to see and then decide to stay on with Jesus. Like Samuel from our First Reading they had much to learn about the ways of the Lord and many surprises (and a few shocks) in store for them. Crucially, they eventually came to learn that they belonged to the Lord Jesus in every way.

St Paul in the excerpt from his First Letter to the Corinthians tells us that we who are baptised into Christ likewise belong to Him. Our bodies are now members and parts of the body of Christ; our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit; we have been bought and paid for by Christ Himself, Paul says. He ends by urging us to use our bodies in ways that give glory to God.

Being disciples who are always learning from Jesus, and apostles seeking to introduce Him to others, we ask ourselves; How can I use my body, my faculties, gifts, strengths and frailties in such a way to serve and glorify God who has made me God's son/daughter through my Baptism into Christ? How can I live and share the Lord's invitation that I've accepted to 'Come and see' with others? These are the challenges and hopes God's word puts before us over the coming week whatever it might hold.

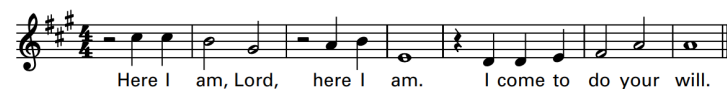
### HYMNS AND RESPONSES FOR SUNDAY MASSES

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM: "PSALM 40: HERE I AM"

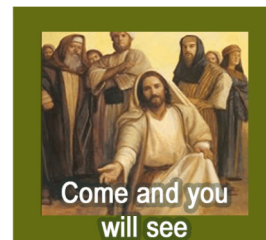


#### COMMUNION: "WE ARE MANY PARTS"
