## *The Pastor's Pen....*

### **Parish CWL Closing.**

It's with sadness that I have to announce that after 62 years of friendship and service the ladies of our Corinda Graceville Catholic Women's league have decided to close. It's with deeper gratefulness that I want these women and all of our Parish community to give thanks for the CWL (until 1974 the Catholic Daughters of Australia CDA) and all that they have offered to so many of us. They, and their deceased members, helped build and fund our Christ the King School at Graceville, which is where this organisation began in 1959 in response to a need seen by Father O'Shaughnessy. They became a group of friendship, prayer and service for our entire Parish as we know it today when Graceville and Corinda Catholic communities became one with the leadership of Fr. Tim Harris, now Bishop of Townsville.

Going beyond this, the CWL women have helped many locals in the floods, supported missions and orphanages, worked as catechists and sacristans, provided funeral hospitality and participated on numerous Parish groups and committees. They have befriended and supported Priests and seminarians down throughout these years, too. Above all they have stuck together with prayer for us all, extending their hands and hearts in practical help when and wherever needed.

These times, as I've said to you so very often, are times of great change for our Church and society. We are all feeling the strain of this transition to a new, as yet not fully revealed future. The present members will continue to meet at various local cafe's for a coffee and chat, for mutual support. This is good news because they have shared a lifetime together, with many ups and downs, and this support deserved to continue. Most importantly as faith-filled Resurrection people we give thanks to Almighty God for all that has been granted to and through our CWL ladies, saying a firm Yes to what God has in store for us.

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the 11th April at the 9.30am Mass, all past and present CWL Corinda Graceville members and their friends, families and fellow Parishioners are invited to gather for the 9.30am Sunday Mass at Christ the King Church, Graceville, to give thanks to our God for these women and for decades of the CWL in our Parish. It will be a Mass brimming over with Easter Resurrection hope and with gratitude in our hearts. Please be sure to book your place for this occasion as seats are limited 132 persons.

We are now entering Holy Week. Jesus became fully one of us so that we might see and understand the intimate care and love of God always and everywhere. The liturgies and celebrations of this coming week help us to deepen this gift within us. They call upon us to likewise see and understand God living now, this time of ours, in and through us. Jesus' story is being written and retold again in you and me for God has made God's home in us. As a wise person once said to me; 'We are now the skin that God is in'. What happened to Jesus is, by faith, happening now in each and all who look to and follow Him. Let's celebrate all of Holy Week as well and as much as we can as we prepare for Christ's Eastering in us!

## The Pastor's Pen continued ....

I don't often quote others for their voice and words are their own. However, I feel compelled to offer these words of Archbishop Peter Comensoli of Melbourne because they speak a truth that I, and perhaps many of us desperately need to hear and make our own.

*"We can tend to think that the biggest questions in our Church are about the shortage of priests and religious vocations, or the lack of lay governance, or not enough resources, or a weakening of Catholic schooling, or the disassociation of young people. We think, if only we can solve these then all will be well.*

*But really, as a brother bishop has put it rather bluntly, the greatest challenge faced by our Church today is a loss of confidence in Jesus Christ. We need to face this perhaps uncomfortable truth.*

*Pope Francis has called on local Churches not to struggle to hold on to what they have left behind but to see themselves as a mission Church moving outward. This will require the renewal of the lay apostolic life."*

I don't know who the bluntly spoken 'brother Bishop' was, but I do know he's on the money and that Bishop Comensoli is, too, when he offers us these wise, prophetic words.

Bring Easter on, Lord God; Bring it on to us!

- **You must book each person individually and complete all contact details for each individual person** – even babies in arms - so that we have an accurate and complete list for contact tracing purposes.
- **Please print your tickets and bring them with you.**
- When booking for St Joseph's Church you may need to choose to book **INSIDE** the Church, or **UNDERCOVER** in the Mall, or **OUTSIDE** on the lawn. The place that you book is the place that you must sit at on the day.
- **When arriving for any liturgy please come 30 minutes early.**
- **At St Joseph's Church** there will only be one access point to enter the entire church precinct. **All will have to enter from Oxley Road, into the main entry of the church grounds.** Please traverse safely along the footpath on Oxley Road to the main entry point. There will be no access for the general public at any other point around St Joseph's Church.
- **Those with mobility issues**, can safely enter from the Martindale Street driveway, or the covered walkway from the parish carpark. Please note that these access points will only be available for parishioners with mobility needs.
- **For Christ the King Church** you can only book for inside the Church. Access to Christ the King Church is via the front door only. However the side ramp is available for those with mobility needs.
- **Please remain socially distanced.** Each family unit must be 1.5m away from other families, when queuing at the entry, when on site for the Liturgy, when receiving Communion, and when leaving.
- Hand sanitiser will be available.

**Easter Choir Rehearsals:** are **TODAY** Sunday 28th March at St Joseph's Church. Practice for **Good Friday** will be at 2pm until 3pm. Practice for **Holy Saturday** will be held from 3pm to 4pm.

**Wednesday morning Mass:** will be held at 9am at St Joseph's Church as usual.

**The Sacred Paschal Triduum:** is ONE liturgical celebration that begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, celebrates the Passion of Our Lord on Good Friday, reaches its high point at the Easter Vigil, and closes on Easter Sunday evening. The celebration of the Triduum is the culmination and core of the entire liturgical year.

**Thursday 1st April is Holy Thursday:** Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7pm at St Joseph's Corinda. **There will be no morning Mass at St Joseph's Corinda this Thursday morning.**

**Holy Thursday: BRING YOUR PROJECT COMPASSION OFFERINGS AND PLACE IN THE BASKET** at the front door of the church. This will be brought forward as our offering to those in need around the world.

**Good Friday:** is a day of **fast** and **abstinence from meat**. Fasting from food applies to eighteen to fifty-nine year olds. To fast is to eat one full meal and no more than two smaller meals not equalling a second meal that day. Abstinence applies to everyone fourteen or older with no upper age limit.

**Stations of the Cross:** will be held on Good Friday 2nd April at 10am at Christ the King Church Graceville.

**The annual Prayer Vigil for those on Death Row:** Please join the Catholic Justice & Peace Commission's annual prayer vigil for those on death row. It will be held on Good Friday at Christ the King Catholic Church, Graceville at 12pm. If you wish to attend this vigil please book at <https://app.tickets.org.au/eb/deathpenaltyvigil>

**Good Friday - Celebration of the Passion of the Lord:** is the second part of the Sacred Paschal Triduum. The primary elements of the Celebration are the proclamation of the Passion, the Solemn Intercessions, the Adoration of the Holy Cross and Holy Communion. Jesus' life-giving death is the focus in the proclamation of the Passion and the Adoration of the Holy Cross. The cross is an instrument of life. To remain Covid Safe, we will not process forward individually to Venerate the Cross. This year we will have a Public Veneration of the Cross. The Cross will be taken to each section of the congregation and we will venerate together by kneeling before the Cross.

**Good Friday Collection:** The annual collection for the **Support of the Church in the Holy Land** takes place on Good Friday. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from the Good Friday collection. The collection is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land again on this Good Friday. Please also pray that peace and harmony will become a reality in the birthplace of Jesus, the 'Prince of Peace'.
