

The Pastor's Pen....

My sincere thanks to Frs. Frank, Pio and Pan, and to our Parish Pastoral and Office staff for attending to the liturgical, pastoral and administrative work during my Annual Leave. My retreat and holiday time away were much needed and refreshing. I also appreciate your support and prayers. All of you were often in my mind and my heart. Thank you.

The old world and ways are ending these days and a new way of living and being together is slowly emerging, coming into sharper focus. This is the way things are, on big journeys, and when the times and eras are changing. We have much further to travel, but we can no longer be in any doubt that we have most certainly left the past behind us.



Jesus left us the Eucharist as He was about to make the greatest journey of them all, His journey from death into life in God. He offers to take all of us along with Him on this path if we will remember Him and follow Him. On the night of His betrayal, the eve before His Crucifixion, He gave us a permanent memorial of what He was doing for us. Our Parish family of faith offers us God's mercy and compassion as we make our way down through the hallways of history, keeping the message and ministry of Jesus alive in this time of momentous change.

Remembering the mother of St Mary MacKillop ~ Flora MacKillop

Last Sunday marked the 130th anniversary of the death of St Mary MacKillop's mother, Flora MacKillop – a woman who devoted her life to God, her family and to the Sisters who joined her daughter Mary in her work.

Flora gave birth to eight children. Three she gave to God in the priesthood and religious life. She mourned five who were lost before they turned 30, one while still a baby.

No stranger to sorrows, Flora's life ended suddenly in the notorious wreck of the Ly-ee-moon off the coast of Eden, on the south coast of New South Wales.

Yet we do not remember Flora as a tragic figure. Rather, we recall her great qualities of motherhood and acclaim a stoic woman who devoted her whole life to God, her family, and to the Josephite Sisters who joined St Mary MacKillop in her work.

Flora travelled widely after Mary had established her new congregation, sometimes taking her daughter Annie. On her travels she would stay with relations and family friends in different parts of western Victoria, as well as Melbourne.

Flora decided to travel to Sydney in 1886 to help Mary with a fundraising bazaar. It was common at the time to travel by ship from Melbourne up the east coast to Port Jackson or Sydney Harbour.

Mary was expecting Flora's arrival, but tragedy struck – 71 passengers drowned on May 30, 1891, when the Ly-ee-moon was dashed against a reef. The only survivor was a boy of 11, pulled unconscious through a porthole.
