*The Pastor's Pen....*

Many years ago a man much smarter than I am warned me to beware of the coming 'tyranny of the clerks' when everything would be on a list, having to be accounted, ticked off and signed for at every step. What a prophetic wisdom and insight that man had!

I don't think that Jesus is being like a 'clerk' nor do I think that He is buying into any such 'tyranny' when he instructs His apostles setting out on their first mission. In fact, if we listen to the list given in the Gospel we discover that it's more a list of what not to take than of things to be taken. No food, no bags, no money, only a walking stick to lean on, some sandals for their feet and a spare shirt to soak up their sweat. The only other thing that Jesus ordered was that the Twelve go out in pairs so that they were never alone or in danger of feeling unsupported and isolated.



These days, such simplicity seems to have become impossible for a raft of sensible reasons, and some not so sensible ones, too. Everything we do and everywhere we go it's protocols and lists, photos, phone numbers, email addresses and codes, signing this or that, keeping records that fill up rooms and/or hard drives, with our purses and wallets chock full of cards for every activity. It would appear that the 'tyranny' foretold is almost complete and that the 'clerks' have won the day. Smile now, for this is that age in which we live and this is the way that we have created by what we've done and by what we've failed to do.

A worrying part in all of this is that our data, recorded in the many ways I've mentioned above, isn't secure. This shouldn't surprise us in the least because human beings get our data and human beings are innately fallible, given to error and susceptible to temptation. Over the course of the past 16 pandemic-ridden months I've noticed a big uptick in my unsolicited phone calls and junk emails. Perhaps you have noticed something similar? Big Data as it's called loves our details, every little piece of them, paying good money for it for reasons both beneficial and nefarious. This fact requires of us renewed vigilance so that our rightful privacy is respected and protected and that our 'data' is used only for the purposes for which it was collected, our health and the health of the community.

As for our apostolic mission, carrying on the command of Christ and the work of the first Apostles, that we witness to the healing compassionate love of Christ and the sharing of His word of life, simple and direct is always best. Some will by their nature prefer the 'big show' as I call it. May God bless their efforts. The rest of us do best in small and flexible pairs, partners in a little team or group, supporting one another in our homes, schools, colleges and work and play places and in our own local Parish communities of faith.

Whatever we may think of my friend's foresight from years ago, Jesus always wants us to go out to people and face to face, meet, serve and witness to them of God's saving love. Trust in the Lord who walks with us and reliance on each other is obligatory above all else. Everything required other than these two things is a necessary means to this end.

**The Church of Brisbane and our Parish Rejoices:** On Tuesday 29th June, the Feast of Sts Peter and Paul four men were ordained in St Stephen's Cathedral Brisbane. By 3.30pm that afternoon, the Cathedral was full and the Ordination ceremony was ready to commence. ## Covid Safe Requirements at Church

- The “Check In Qld App” is now being used at all Masses, Funerals, Baptisms and Weddings.
- For those who own a smart phone please bring your phone with you to church. Have it switched on when you arrive at church. Please see instructions below on how to get the “Check In Qld App” on your phone.
- Please use the “Check In Qld App” by scanning the QR code as you approach the church entrance.
- You will need to show the marshal that you have checked in on your phone before entering the church. You will also need to advise the marshal how many people you have checked in on your app that day. We still need to be able to tally for the correct numbers allowed at each church. (Currently 105 at Corinda and 66 at Graceville)
- For those who do not have a smart phone, that's ok - we can still get you into church. You will need to approach the marshal and advise them of your name, address and phone number. The marshal will encode this on an ipad onto the Check In Qld site on your behalf.
- The use of the “Check In Qld App” is now mandatory for Places of Worship, whether it be via your own device or via a parish owned device. We can no longer use paper lists or online booking.

### Please remember your Covid Safe practices at church:

- Come early to Mass so that everyone can be checked in prior to Mass commencing.
- Enter the church via the front door only. You still need to register your attendance with the marshal - even if you have used the “Check In Qld App”.
- People in the same household can sit together, but please distance yourself from others who are not in your household. Spread across all of the church.
- Keep 1.5 metres between you and others when queuing, entering the church, processing to Communion and leaving the church.
- Remember to turn your phone off once you are seated in the church.
- Please remember that all of our marshals are volunteers - so please be patient.

### Check in and you're good to go!

To download the Check In Qld App please

- ⇒ visit [www.covid19.qld.gov.au/check-in-qld](http://www.covid19.qld.gov.au/check-in-qld) for links to download the app from Google Play or Apple App stores
- ⇒ enter your details once when you first open the app
- ⇒ open the app when you next visit us
- ⇒ select 'Check in Now' and scan or enter the code

Using this digital check in means your details will be stored securely by the Queensland Government for 56 days to assist with COVID-19 contact tracing (if needed).

The Check In Qld app is safe, secure and private. By using it, you are helping Queensland to stay safe, and you can be contacted quickly and easily if there is any risk of exposure to the virus.


### GATHERING: "GLORY AND PRAISE TO OUR GOD"
