The Pastor's Pen.... This weekend across the Archdiocese is given over to the annual appeal from Catholic Missions. We will have various guest speakers at our Masses address us about the work of Catholic Missions, asking for our donations and our prayers as they raise for us this vital missions work here in Australia and overseas. Please welcome our speakers who are local students, giving us their time and insights and support this important annual appeal.

By good fortune our weekend readings fit well with the topic of our mission and God's mission to save us and our world. The First Reading tells us of the joy and hope God's people experienced when they were called back home from their exile to the lands of the North. God delivered Israel from the ends of the earth making sure that all were included in the returning throng; the blind and lame, mothers and those with child. Though they departed and were scattered in tears and with sadness, they returned in joy along a path surrounded with refreshing waters and on a level road so none would stumble.

Our Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews continues exploring the reality of Jesus as our High Priest. He was chosen by God for this important role as a mediator between us, the people, and God. He is able to empathise with us in all of our weaknesses for He was fully one of us, though without sin. He was able to be the perfect High Priest for us because He also was of God and His sacrifice was all for us.

How many, and for how very long, serving and sacrificing women and men have represented us in remote parts of Australia and in lands far flung from our shores. We have our mission here, while they take the Word of the Lord to people, and live in places we never get to visit. They mediate God's mission in these place for us and for God.

In St. Mark's Gospel over some weeks we've listened to Jesus teaching His disciples about the values and way of the Kingdom of God. Mostly, they haven't comprehended what Jesus was saying and like so many of us have struggled with His message. Ever sensitive to His disciples confusion and resistance, Jesus put before them examples of what His words meant in practice.

This weekend Jesus and his disciples encounter the blind beggar Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, as they were leaving Jericho. Bartimaeus cried out for mercy and help and refused to be silenced. Coming to Jesus, as he was called to do, Jesus asked "What do you want me to do for you?" Bartimaeus replied to Jesus "Let me see again." Affirming that his faith had saved him, Jesus gave him back his sight and he joined the disciples and the crowd following Jesus along the road.

This is what we need. It's what all disciples always need. We have to call out to Jesus for help in our confusion and darkness. We have to trust that He will hear us and ask each of us what it is that we want Him to do for us? He is the only one who brings us the light, the wisdom and insight, opening wide our eyes, minds and hearts to the light and way of God and God's Kingdom. It's this light and insight that we are then asked to offer freely to those we meet, in our words and deeds and through our way of life. This is our mission here where we find ourselves and the core work of missionaries everywhere.

Lastly, some words from Archbishops Mark Coleridge (Brisbane) and Timothy Costelloe (Perth) at the conclusion of the First General Assembly of the Plenary Council. The next gathering is scheduled for July 2022 in Sydney. As space permits in the coming weeks I will print here some responses from participants in this historic event for our Australian Catholic Church.

In the closing Mass, Archbishop Mark summed the week up beautifully by describing how he was feeling at the end of the First General Assembly - "Weary and a bit ragged, because it was very hard work; relieved, even slightly surprised, because so much could have gone wrong; satisfied, because it has produced real fruit; grateful to God and to each other, because it has all been more gift than hard work; intrigued to see what happens between now and the second assembly in the middle of next year. It's all been a marvel of technology; a mountain of superb work from so many people, and a maelstrom of words, insights, feelings, convictions and resolutions all with deep respect for each other, even and perhaps especially when we disagreed ... But, above all, the assembly has been a monument to grace and faith – God's grace and the Church's faith in this fraught time."

Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB (Chair of the Commission & President of the Plenary Council) summed up his experience by describing the First Assembly as "an inspiring, challenging and sometimes unsettling week for many of us".

at 7.00pm on Tuesday 2nd November.


A Scroll of Life with the names of those members of our parish community who have died in the last 12 months and the reading of the names will be part of our Parish Memorial Mass.

You are also invited to bring photographs of your deceased loved ones to the Parish Memorial Mass and place them on the table near the Baptismal font before Mass.



Book of Life: Due to COVID-19 safety, once again this year we will not be writing the names of our deceased loved ones in the Book of Life during November. A **memorial card** (pictured left, to replace the **Book Of Life**), can be used to enter the name/s of your deceased loved ones. This card can be collected from the Marshals desk or the Perspex stands at the doors of the church. Please bring the cards back to Mass from NEXT WEEKEND, with the names of your deceased loved ones written into the card, and place them in the baskets near the Baptismal font in either church (from next weekend). They will stay before us in each of our churches throughout November as we pray for our deceased sisters and brothers in Christ. This process of using the cards will alleviate the sharing of pens and paper and help keep us COVID safe. Please remember to be socially distanced when placing cards in the basket. All names will be recorded in the Book of Life at a later time.

Envelopes for Mass Offerings, can also be collected from the Perspex stands at the doors of the church. Please place the name(s) of your deceased loved ones on the envelope (or on a list inside) along with your offering. Father Mark will record these names for Masses. This envelope is to be placed in the normal collection bowl near the front door of the church; the same bowl as for all Parish planned giving and other cash donations.



**Christ the King School and Parish development proposal
which will allow Outside School Hours Care to open in the current Parish Centre.**

- As you may be aware, there needed to be a redesignation (re-zoning) of land, including the former Presentation Sisters Convent at 23 Randolph Street, to allow for education activities.
- A formal public consultation has started on a Ministerial Infrastructure Designation (MID). This is an application to the Minister for an improvement to CTK facilities to support the ongoing needs of the school and parish.
- Essentially our planned works have not changed, but we need to follow the process for securing the necessary government approval.
- The State infrastructure process required a master plan to be submitted for Christ the King for the next ten years. This included an option to expand the admin block with its library and classrooms in the future at a stage if or when the budget allowed, and if this type of facility upgrade was seen as necessary.
- There is no current plan or timing for this type of project.
- For the benefit of neighbours, the government department requested a sketch of what a building may look like if one was ever to be put in place. (This is where the building picture has come from that you may have seen.) It has caused some concern amongst neighbours and parishioners.
- At this stage Christ the King Parish and School are committed only to the OSHC project that we have previously advised our community of.

Details of the project: Setting up the CTK Outside School Hours Care in the current Parish Centre next to the school at 19 Randolph Street. The steps to achieve this are:

1. Internal refurbishment to be undertaken in the house at 23 Randolph Street (Former Convent) as soon as possible.
2. Parish run programs (for example The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd) to move into the refurbished facilities one house along at 23 Randolph Street.
3. CTK Outside School Hours Care move from their current school classroom into their own facility at 19 Randolph Street.

To move forward with this project we now require parish and family assistance. The public consultation process will be considering submissions from parish and school families, staff and neighbours before deciding on approving our required application. Any parishioners who see the benefit of having Outside School Hours Care continuing at Christ the King, and operating in their own facility next door to the school, please take the time to complete the simple steps outlined below to have your opinion counted.




