The Pastor's Pen....

Leaving something old behind us and moving into something new is all about the connections we make between these two experiences. Last weekend we listened to Jesus tell us that after the time of final tribulation people would see 'the Son of Man coming on the clouds with great power and glory, with the Angels who would gather people in from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.' In saying this, Jesus was drawing on the words of the Prophet Daniel, which we get to hear this weekend as we celebrate the Universal Kingship of Christ. The connection is between the end of time and final things and what they will reveal to us when Christ is shown in all of his glory.

You will recall that I spoke to you in my homily last weekend about the meaning and purpose of movement and change, and living in a world that is constantly shifting around us and even within us. This purpose, I said, was nothing less than the resurrection of humanity from the dust of death, the renewal of the universe, the healing of creation, with the casting out and banishment of sin and evil from our lives and from the world. I pointed you to the transformation we celebrate and witness in the Eucharist as the obvious foreshadowing of this, our change and reconfiguration into Jesus Christ Himself.

Our remodelling/changing into Christ, expressed and received by us in the Eucharistic Sacrament, is called the Paschal Mystery. When, after the Consecration of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood, the Priest asks us in a form of words to proclaim the Mystery Faith, this is what we are announcing, the Paschal Mystery of Christ and of us through our faith in Him.

It's appropriate then that the last weekend Gospel text of this old Church year is drawn from the trial of Jesus before Pilate as told to us in St. John's words. We hear that He is a King, but not one like the powerful of this world. Rather, His Kingship comes through service, unselfish love for all and for the salvation of the world through His freely accepted sacrifice, in other words it comes about through the Paschal Mystery of the Lord's dying and rising for us. He is a King of truth and life, holiness and grace, justice, love and peace, to quote the wonderful Preface of this Solemnity.

How very different this is to those whose leadership is not with and for us, but over us and for their own policies and profit? How different is the way of Christ the King from those who seek to lead us by amassing power, prestige, personal glory, entitlement and wealth? We see nothing like this in Jesus nor in His story and nothing like it in the Eucharist which is given freely to us and for all.

Our New Year, the First Sunday of Advent on the 27/28 November, connects us back through the Gospel text to Jesus speaking about the last things and final days, now seen and understood by us through the lens of His eternal Kingship where His Cross is His throne and His thorny crown and suffering is revealed as our way to new life in Him. Most surely we await Our Lord's coming at the end of our lives and at the end of time and history, but simultaneously we are awaiting His coming right now, His Advent in this moment of time and history in which we find ourselves living, by grace, hopefully in Him.

Advent Reflection: Advent is such a busy time of year and we so easily forget that, at its heart, it is meant to be a time of preparation, waiting and hope for the coming of Jesus into our world and lives. To remind us of this, the parish has purchased an Advent and Christmas Program that provides an opportunity for us to be still each day, listen to God, and come to know that Jesus is the whole reason for our being. Like Mary proclaimed in her Magnificat: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord." Lk 1:46

The Advent Program "Blessed" is a pocket-sized book that includes daily reflections from the beginning of Advent to the Baptism of the Lord. The book also includes beautiful artwork from the Masters with accompanying artwork reflections.

When booking for St Joseph's you will need to choose to book INSIDE the Church, or UNDERCOVER in the Mall, or OUTSIDE on the lawn. **The area that you book is the area where you MUST sit at Mass.** Please print out your ticket and bring it along with you to Mass.

When arriving for Christmas Mass please come 30 minutes early. At St Joseph's Church there will only be one access point to enter the entire church precinct. All will have to enter from Oxley Road footpath into the main entry of the church grounds. There will be no access for the general public at any other point around St Joseph's Church. However, for those with mobility issues, you can safely enter from the Martindale Street driveway, or the covered walkway from the parish carpark. Please note that these access points will only be available for parishioners with mobility needs or those involved in Mass ministries.

For Christ the King you can only book for inside the Church. Access to Christ the King Church is via the front door only. The side ramp will be available for those with mobility needs.

If you can not access a computer to book, please phone the parish office to book your Mass.

We will need many marshals and ushers at each Mass to ensure it is a Covid Safe event. Please contact the Parish Office if you are able to assist at any Mass.

NEW AUXILIARY BISHOP OF BRISBANE

At this time of great change and challenge, it is a joy for the Church in Brisbane and Australia to welcome the appointment of Fr Tim Norton SVD as Auxiliary Bishop of Brisbane. In some ways it is a surprising appointment, but Fr Tim brings to the ministry of bishop many gifts and experiences required now more than ever as the whole Church seeks to become more missionary.

Born in Sydney in 1958, Tim entered the Divine Word Missionaries in 1984 and was ordained priest in 1991. He then served in Mexico for seven years before undertaking studies in spiritual direction to prepare for formation work in Melbourne preparing men to serve as Divine Word Missionaries. He was then elected Provincial of the Australian Province, and in that role he had close contact with the Archdiocese of Brisbane where the SVD have been and still are an important presence. Since completing his term as Provincial, Tim has been the Director of the *Ad Gentes* course of renewal based at the SVD house in Nemi near Rome.

All of this will equip Tim well for what awaits him in the episcopal ministry in this time and in this place. He will make a real contribution not only locally in Brisbane and Queensland but also nationally and internationally. He comes to us as God's gift and we give thanks to the giver of all gifts. We also welcome Tim as a brother in faith and in mission.

Details of the ordination will follow, and in the meantime we pray for Tim, asking the Lord to breathe into him in a new and deeper way the Holy Spirit who enables us to hear God's Word and speak it to others.


2. We break this bread for all to share, like Jesus showed us.
