The Tastor's Ten....

Sin, what it is and what it isn't, pops up over and over again in the mighty story of the healing of a man born blind. For the Pharisees and Jewish leaders someone born with a defect or disability had this problem because of their own sin, or carried it because of the sin of their ancestors. Sadly, some cultures and people still have this belief to this day, rejecting and even killing children born with 'defects'. Moreover, in Jesus' time and culture it was believed that sinners were rejected even by God and this justified their rejection by their families and community. Again, in some places and people, this is still the thinking.

Not though for Jesus. He saw the man born blind and in him perceived an opportunity to reveal God's love and merciful healing power. He utterly rejected sin as the cause of disabilities and disabilities as a proof of being a sinner. In other words, Jesus totally rejected the thinking of his culture, declaring all disabilities as a gift and an opportunity to let the light of God shine out. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world, he said.

The trajectory of this great story is simple. It can be the pattern of our faith journey, too. The man is touched by Jesus and sent to wash in the pool of Siloam which means 'sent' and then he gains his sight. The man, through all of the following interrogations,



grows in his insight, wisdom and faith. Meanwhile the Pharisees and leaders, who thought that they could see clearly even into God's mind and heart, fall step by step into ever deeper darkness and ignorance. This continues until they reject Jesus himself as a sinner, even despite the clear as day evidence that the healing he worked could only be from God.

The man born blind moves step by steady step into the light, from thinking of Jesus as a healer and a very lucky break in his own lowly and limited life, to perceiving him as a Prophet, then as someone sent by God and finally recognising him as the long awaited Son of Man and Lord, worthy of worship and his allegiance in faith. For this insight the man is once again disowned by his fear-filled family and rejected by the leaders of the Jewish community, only to be found by the Lord Jesus and be accepted as his follower.

This blind man was 'sent' in this story from beginning to end; sent by God into the world, sent by Jesus to wash in a kind of baptism at Siloam, sent into the light with growing insight, sent to witness and speak out the truth before the Pharisees and his family and sent into history and to us as a witness to God's ways and as a model for our Christian journey of faith.

All of us start out 'blind' in this world, but through our baptism and rebirth into Jesus Christ the light of the world, we gain our sight. Now, it's our mission in the Holy Spirit to keep developing this vision and like the man be sent out to bring and to be Jesus' light, hope and mercy in this world to those we see every day. For while we are able to be Him in this world, the world still has the opportunity of seeing in Christ's light.




