The great week of the Pasch, our journey of joining with Christ in his passing over from death to everlasting life, has ended. Now we come to seven weeks of Easter feasting which will take us to Pentecost, the birth of the Church, God's people engaging in the mission and ministry of Christ down through the halls of history. These weeks remind us that we are always an Easter new life people.

Thanks to everyone who pitched in to make Holy Week and the Triduum, the three great days, happen in our Parish this year in ways that were effective, welcoming and full of faith. Musicians, singers, proclaimers of the word, ministers of communion, welcomers, Mass co-ordinators, altar servers, art and environment ministers, Parish choir and our cantors, Office staff, RCIA team, Parish Liturgy Planning Team, Fr. Pius who shared his priesthood and time with us and to all who participated in our worship, sincere thanks for your work and inspiring generosity. Special congratulations to Garura welcomed to full communion in Confirmation and her first Holy Communion and baby Ella baptised into Christ this Easter.

Communion from the Cup.

Alleluia

Only a few days before Easter this year the Archdiocese informed me (and all Priests and Parishes) that the reception of Holy Communion from the cup of Christ's Blood could now be re-introduced. After a prohibition of three years due to the Covid 19 SARS pandemic I'm pleased that this practice can begin again. Reception of both the consecrated bread and wine of Christ's Body and Blood is the most complete sign of our communion with God and with each other in the Eucharist as Christ commanded.

Re-introducing this practice however is not without its challenges. We have to find out if our Extraordinary Ministers of Communion are ready to take on this role, re-institute rosters, prepare these misters to properly take on this important role of service and prepare you, our Parish community, for this restored practice. All of this takes time, effort and planning.

With this in mind and after consulting a number of parishioners, I've decided that this practice will be restored to our liturgy and worship on the Solemnity of the Ascension, the next great feast of our Church. Details about how communion from the cup will happen in each of our churches will be explained to you closer to this date. This will aid in helping our smooth transition back to this practice.

It is important that we all remember that in our participation in and reception of communion from either the plate/host or from the cup/wine or from both elements (consecrated bread and wine) is full communion with our Lord. In other words, reception of either elements or of both are valid and are complete communion reception practices and choices that we can make. However, as I've said above, receiving both of the consecrated and transubstantiated elements is the fullest Eucharistic sign of our communion in Christ.

Some people will choose to stay with the bread only. Others will once again be able to choose the wine only, and many will return to the practice of receiving both elements. These choices are ours to make and are always to respected by us all.

Finally, to repeat myself; When we have sorted out all of the details of this practice, our way of making this happen in the Mass at both of our Parish Churches, this will be explained to you. Then, on the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus promises to be with us always, until the end of time, both forms and elements of Holy Communion with once more be offered to you.

In recent weeks, Archbishop Mark Coleridge has published a document entitled "Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane from 2023" which outlines seven priorities for the Archdiocese. Over the next seven weeks from today, the Second Sunday of Easter until Pentecost, a bulletin insert will introduce one of the seven themes. The first priority is: Teaching Prayer.

Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority One: Teaching Prayer

"We must first find our way into a new and deeper experience of prayer not just as one of many elements in a busy life but as a way of life for all the baptised. Often we urge people to pray but don't really teach them how to pray in a way that moves beyond the prayers of childhood and youth. Now is the time to teach ways of prayer which are mature and allembracing. Christian prayer begins not with speaking but with listening; and learning to pray is therefore learning to listen – to listen even to the silences of God. If all we do is speak, then in the words of Jesus we "babble like the pagans" (Matt 6:7). But if we speak after listening and in response to God who always has the first word, then we speak according to the mind of the Holy Spirit. That's what WITH LAMPS we need to teach and learn."

Installation of Michael Greene: Parishioner Michael Greene is to be installed as Lieutenant of Queensland for the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. 
