**In our readings this week:** we continue to follow the infant Church, and with them ponder the words Jesus gave us at the Last Supper.

The First Reading shows how the disciples faced the growing tension between the Greek and Hebrew traditions. After discernment and prayer, they delegate tasks. The Psalm is one of praise for God's word and God's work. It is also a prayer of trust. For St Peter, in the Second Reading, it is clear that Christ is the foundation; the living cornerstone for all believers. We are to set ourselves close to him.

The Gospel is from Jesus' discourse to his friends before he suffered and died. They are words of encouragement. In the light of the Resurrection, the disciples must have drawn strength from them. Jesus is with them: the Way, the Truth and the Life.

As we face this week, let us, too, keep our eyes on Jesus, even when we are concerned by all that is happening around us. May we strive to follow the Lord as the Way, in joy and hope.

**May is the month of Mary in the Church:** "Within the cycle of a year, the Church unfolds the whole mystery of Christ from the incarnation and birth until his Ascension, the day of Pentecost, and the expectation of blessed hope and of the Lord's return .... In celebrating this annual cycle of Christ's mysteries, the Church honours with special love Mary, the Mother of God, who is joined by an inseparable bond to the saving work of her Son. In her the Church holds up and admires the most excellent effect of the redemption and joyfully contemplates, as in a flawless image, that which the Church itself desires and hopes wholly to be." Vatican Council II *Sacroscantum Concilium* #102, 103.

This week, on Saturday 13th May, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima, on the anniversary of the appearance of Mary to three shepherd children in the town of Fatima, in Portugal, in 1917. Between May 13 and October 13 of that year, Mary appeared six times to brother and sister Francisco 8 and Jacinta 6, and their cousin Lucia 9. Perhaps we can make a special effort to pray the Rosary this week.

## Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

### Priority Four: Responding to Abuse and the Abused

"In responding to abuse and the abused, we need to move beyond considerations of law and finance... Of course we need to attend to legal and financial matters, but the paramount concern needs to be the good of those abused. Not all victims and survivors look to the Church for spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and care, but some do and others may in time, if ever trust can be established. We can learn from experience elsewhere in seeking to respond more effectively to abuse and the abused. Unless we do, this will remain a gaping wound – certainly for victims and survivors but for the whole Church as well – which makes it hard for us to move in the future."

**Choir Practice:** will be held on Thursday 11th May at 7.00pm at St Joseph's Church. New singers are always welcome.

**Youth Group for high school students and young adults:** 6.30pm to 8.30pm Friday 12th May (including a light dinner) at St Joseph's Hall Corinda. Come along and meet our new Youth Worker Claire. All young people are most welcome to attend. Youth Group is held every Friday evening of the school term.

**Communion from the Cup:** The Archdiocese has advised that the reception of Holy Communion from the cup of Christ's Blood can now be re-introduced, after three years of Covid restrictions. Reception of both the consecrated bread and wine of Christ's Body and Blood is the most complete sign of our communion with God and with each other in the Eucharist as Christ commanded. Re-introducing this practice however is not without its challenges.
