With these words the Risen Lord stood among his fear-filled followers as we hear in today's Gospel. He breathed the Holy Spirit upon them. With their hearts filled with joy, Jesus sent them out to bring the fire of his love to all.

With the Holy Spirit transforming their lives, (in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles), the disciples began speaking in many different languages. Christ was calling them to share the Gospel to the whole world. We too are baptised in this same Spirit.

Each of us has been given a unique gift, so that together as a community we become the risen Christ, bringing love and goodness to all people, as proclaimed in the Second Reading. Filled with the Holy Spirit we become a new creation in the Lord. The Psalm joyfully proclaims a time of rejuvenation as the spirit of the Lord moves over the earth.



On this Pentecost Sunday, let us ask for a spirit of renewal for the whole Christian community. We pray that we may overcome any fear, doubt or differences, and be united in giving expression to the joy of Resurrection, each of us doing so in our own unique way, while rooted in the same spirit of transforming love.

Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church: In 1964 St Paul VI declared the Blessed Virgin Mary as 'Mother of the Church, that is to say of all Christian people, the faithful as well as the pastors, who call her the most loving Mother' and established that 'the Mother of God should be further honoured and invoked by the entire Christian people by this most tender of titles.'

In 2018 Pope Francis added a feast day for Mary, Mother of the Church to be celebrated on the Monday following Pentecost – and the date he chose was intentional. On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the birthday of the Church, and on the memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church, we celebrate the fact that Mary, as the mother of Our Lord, is intrinsically linked to the Church as her mother. This year the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church is celebrated on Monday 29th May.

In issuing his decree to add this feast day to the Church's calendar, Pope Francis wished to promote this devotion to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety."

Scripture, the decree said, depicts Mary at the foot of the Cross. There she became the Mother of the Church when she "accepted her Son's testament of love and welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons and daughters to be reborn unto life eternal."

**The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary:** This feast celebrates the Virgin Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, as told in the Gospel of Luke, and her example of faith in God's word and sensitivity to the Spirit.

The feast was introduced into the Franciscan calendar by St Bonaventure in the thirteenth century, and was extended in 1389 to the entire Latin Church to heal the divisions in the Western Church of the time.

The feast has been assigned to the last day of May, between the Solemnity of the Annunciation and the Birth of St John the Baptist, to conform more closely to the Gospel account.

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Mass to celebrate the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be celebrated at 9am on Wednesday 31st May at St Joseph's Church Corinda.

# Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

## Priority Seven: Embedding Synodal Governance

We have begun the long and complex process of moving towards a synodal mode of governance in the Church, but the process is far from complete; and there is much to be done to embed synodal governance more securely at every level in the Archdiocese... Synodality implies inclusion, and therefore we will have to keep asking how we might at every level include women in the decision-making processes of the Archdiocese. So too synodality requires transparency and accountability, and we will have to keep asking what we need to do make the Archdiocese more transparent and accountable.

**The Lord's Day:** When the COVID pandemic struck, I joined other bishops in deciding for a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Now that the pandemic seems to be receding, it is good for us to reflect not only upon the Sunday obligation but upon the meaning of Sunday itself.

To call the first day of the week Sunday recalls the Roman name, but from the first Christians it was always called the Lord's Day, in honour of the Risen Christ who is the true light of the world and the source of life. The Lord's Day was the weekly Easter and the weekly Pentecost, because on the first day Jesus Christ rose from the dead and breathed the Holy Spirit into the Church. It was the day that looked back to the first day of creation and forward to the last day of the Lord's return in glory. Even in times of persecution, Christians remained faithful unto death to the assembly of the Lord's Day.

The spontaneous practice of the early days eventually became Church law. Yet it is not law that draws us to Mass but the Lord's desire to eat the Passover with us (cf Luke 22:15). The deepest reason we go to Mass on Sunday is not because we have decided or because the Church requires it but because we are drawn there by his desire for us. In coming to Mass, we surrender to the Lord's love and let ourselves be drawn by him who wants to speak to our heart and share his feast with us.

Therefore, in the Archdiocese of Brisbane from Pentecost Sunday of this year (28 May 2023) the pandemic dispensation will be withdrawn and the Sunday obligation will be restored, so that all of us, responding to the Risen Lord's call, may say with one heart and voice, "This is the day which the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).

**Bishop Ken Howell:** The Holy Father has appointed Bishop Ken Howell, currently an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Brisbane, as the seventh Bishop of the Diocese of Toowoomba. Pope Francis made the official announcement in Rome at noon (8:00 pm local time) on Wednesday 24th May 2023. Bishop Ken said "I am deeply humbled to be called by Pope Francis to shepherd this local Church and I thank him sincerely. I realise that I have been given a great responsibility to care for the faithful and to engage in the life of the broader community across the Toowoomba Diocese. Can I ask all people to pray for me. Your prayer will be my greatest support." Bishop Ken's installation as the seventh Bishop of Toowoomba will be held on 11 July 2023 at St Patrick's Cathedral, Toowoomba.

**Communion from the Cup:** reception of Holy Communion from the cup of Christ's Blood has now been re-introduced at all Masses in our parish. For the safety and health of everyone, please follow the local custom when receiving Communion: do not kneel when receiving Communion, please receive the host in your hand, not on your tongue, and please drink from the chalice (do not dip [intinct] the host into the chalice).

**St Joseph's School Sponsored Mass:** Welcome to the students, families and staff of St Joseph's School who help lead ministries in our 5.30pm Saturday Mass this weekend. It is wonderful to have you celebrate with us.

**Children's Liturgy:** will be held today, Sunday 28th May, at the 8am Mass at St Joseph's, then next weekend at the 9.30am Mass at Christ the King on Sunday 4th June, alternating between the two churches each Sunday morning. All primary school aged children, and all children enrolled in the Sacramental Program are welcome to attend.
