## The Pastor's Pen....

In a world full of hungry people, where shortages and starvation are an ever present reality, we are counted amongst those who are being well fed. At a time in the life of the Church when many believers here and overseas go for weeks or even months without being able to celebrate and receive the nourishment of the Eucharist, we experience an abundance of opportunities to gather for Mass and to participate in the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.

I hope that we realise we have these gifts and graces, when many don't, and that we are thankful for them, because thanksgiving is at the heart of the Eucharist and it lies at the core of true Christian prayer and living. Why? Because Christ is risen as Lord, having overcome the darkness of sin and death and he is working with and through us in the Holy Spirit to establish the reign of God in this and in every age.

Corpus Christi, the Latin name for our solemnity, asks us to focus on all of God's gifts and graces, particularly on the gift of the abiding sacramental presence of the risen Lord in the Eucharist. His presence comes to us in the shape and form of bread and wine, fruits of the earth and works of our human hands as we pray in every Mass. By faith, and through the effective words of Jesus and the powerful action of God's Spirit, these humble earthly gifts are transformed so as to sacramentally bring and communicate to us the real life and presence of the ever living Son of God, our Saviour.

These holy gifts are taken into us so that we might grow to become evermore like Jesus Christ in our attitudes, words, deeds and way of living. They come, better still, he comes to us as food and drink, so accessible to us, so that we human beings might welcome him with thankful and grateful hearts, letting him come alive in us. The sacrament of the Eucharist comes about when we, the church, gather in faith and prayer, for where two or three are gathered in his name, he is with us. From another perspective, it is the Eucharistic sacrament of the Lord's self giving and sacrificial love that makes us into the Church, makes us into and sustaining us as the people of God on our journey through this world towards our eternal heavenly home.

**In the words of the Prayer after Communion;** Grant, O Lord, we pray, that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood. **And, as Jesus says to us in John's Gospel;** Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day. Surely this is more than enough for us to be grateful and thankful to God as we celebrate our Eucharist today and every day.

**Tap & Pay Terminals:** have been installed at the entrances of the churches and are now operational. In these post Covid times we are aware that many people no longer carry cash, and our cash collections at Mass have been impacted by this over the past three years. Like all households and businesses, things do not get cheaper and the bills keep arriving. The generosity of our parishioners to keep our parish financial, maintained and pastoral has been extraordinary. We thank each and everyone of you for your support and generosity. So many support the parish through the planned giving envelopes, and regular direct debit / credit card payments, but for those who are not comfortable carrying cash, or who are unable to commit to a regular direct debit, the Tap & Pay terminals are an easy way to support your parish.

The screens display four donation options: \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00 or 'other amount'. Simply touch the amount you wish to offer. If you touch the \$5.00, \$10.00, or \$20.00 amounts the screen will prompt you to tap your card for that chosen amount and it will show that your transaction has been successful. If you touch 'other amount' the screen will prompt you to type in the amount you wish to donate and then you simply tap your card when the screen is ready.

Without the support of our wonderful parish community we could not exist. Thank you to everyone for every way you support your parish community. The terminals will be operating next weekend.

### **St. Vincent De Paul Winter Appeal**

- A finalisation of our reflections and learnings from the Easter Triduum liturgies and a review of our liturgies during Easter Time.
- The introduction of some simple actions to be more welcoming to visitors, including making the pew cards with the Mass responses more available.
- A review of the status of the liturgical ministries and new volunteers joining the liturgical ministries.
- An update on an investigation being performed regarding the possible introduction of digital screens in both churches.

For the safety and health of everyone, please follow the local custom when receiving Communion: do not kneel when receiving Communion, please receive the host in your hand, not on your tongue, and please drink from the chalice (do not dip [intinct] the host into the chalice).
