## The Pastor's Pen....

St. Paul says that by turning everything to their good God cooperates with all those who love God, with all those God has called according to God's purpose. Sometimes it's easy to see that this is true as we sense God bringing us good and grace from even confusing and difficult circumstances. At other times, especially when we are in the midst of pain, loss and grief it's hard indeed to perceive any good at all ever arising from what we're going through. Nevertheless, Paul who suffered so much himself, insists that everything has God's finger at work in it and releases God's power to shape us into true images of Jesus Christ. This is a mighty statement of faith, the boldness of which we can only assess and evaluate often only in hindsight.

We are now in the third and final weekend of the centre of Matthew's Gospel (Chapter 13) focused as it is on the coming, the workings and the value of the Kingdom of Heaven. There are seven parables / meaningful stories about this in Chapter 13, as follows;

Two weekends ago. The 'master parable' of the sower and the seeds and what became of them; how those seeds were greeted.

Last weekend. The story of good wheat and bad weeds / darnel mixed in together, which must be sorted out at the end of time; the story of the gardener and the tiny mustard seed; the story of the woman in her kitchen mixing in a little yeast with a lot of wheat flour.

This weekend. A treasure discovered in a field worth selling and sacrificing everything; a perfect pearl of great price found in a market worth everything, and finally, a dragnet hauled in from the sea full of edible and inedible fish that will be sorted out at the end of time.

We can see the pattern in Jesus' teaching, is easy for us to remember. Firstly, the sower and his seeds and their fate, which sets the tone for all that's to come. Next, three more stories about seeds and wheat flour, starting with one that involves good / bad seeds and sorting it all out. Then, three more parables with two being about the value of the kingdom and it's worth to us, ending up with a fishing story that involves sorting out good from bad and useful from useless in the great final catch.

In all of this Kingdom-forming many processes are at work, good is mixed in with bad, God has to work with us, being patient, gentle, wise and skilful in negotiating our choices, responses and free will. Also of note is that twice (Parables 2 and 7) we hear of a necessary final sorting out, a purification if you will.

It's God who gives King Solomon the gift of wisdom (First Reading) to discern good from evil and right from wrong in order to govern God's people. It's God's Kingdom, by God's wisdom, that is emerging from out of history, not ours, and only God's kingdom is the treasure and pearl worth every sacrifice, not our own schemes. If we keep this in mind then it's a lot easier to see what St. Paul meant when he said that, for those who love God all things end up working for their good, for what could ever be better for all of us than the reign of God? This weekend we welcome to our parish an ACN speaker, Ora Duffley, Diocesan Outreach Assistant, who will share with us about the work of Aid to the Church in Need and how we can help our suffering and persecuted brothers and sisters.

Confirmation Preparation: Last week a group of children from our Parish commenced their preparation for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation. This journey commenced at their Baptism and continues with the first step of our preparation program being the Rite of Illumination.

The Rite of Illumination gathers children and their families together to recall their Baptism, the light given to us, and exploration of other symbols of Baptism.

The images of the rite barely do justice to this special milestone however, they do help convey the tone and message of the evening. The literal and symbolic opportunity to consider a world of darkness and how we individually may contribute to brightening and lighting the way for ourselves and those around us.


