The Pastor's Ten....

This month is full of special dates, anniversaries and unusual historical connections.

Of note is the **Solemnity of Mary of the Cross MacKillop** which is celebrated on Tuesday 8th August, our first Australian Saint. Let's also note that the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** falls on the 15th August. We have two Mass options for this Holy Day of obligation; 7.00pm on Monday 14th at Christ the King, Graceville and 9.00am on Tuesday 15th at St. Joseph's Corinda. Many other Masses will be offered across the City on this day, too. A link I want to draw your attention to is that the Second World War ended on August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption, with the final surrender of the Empire of Japan. Along with these religious events the Royal Queensland Exhibition happens at this time of year with the People's Day Public Holiday coming up on Wednesday, 16th August.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, always celebrated on 6th August, falls this weekend. Being an important feast of the Lord it takes precedence over the readings and prayers for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Since 1945 this feast of God's Divine light shining in Jesus and the bright cloud of God's presence on the mountain top coincides with the anniversary of the dropping of the first Atomic Bomb on Hiroshima, 78 years ago.

Three days later, 9th August 1945, another Atomic weapon was dropped on Nagasaki. This day is our faith commemoration of **St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross**, a Discalced Carmelite nun, better known to us by her birth name, Edith Stein. She was a German Jewish philosopher, born in 1891, who converted to Christianity in 1922 being inspired by the writings and spirituality of St. Teresa of Avila. She then became a Carmelite Sister in 1932 at a Convent in Cologne. Four years latter due to Nazi persecution, she moved to a Convent in Echt, Netherlands. When the Nazi's occupied the Netherlands they resented the Catholic Bishops there who had spoken out so stridently against them, ordering the arrest and deportation of all Jews who had become Christians. Sr. Teresa Benedicta (and her sibling Rosa who had also become a Catholic) were arrested and taken to Auschwitz, dying there in the gas chambers on August 9th, 1942.

The light of God shining out of the transfigured in Jesus on the 6th August and a very different light and cloud shining over us at the dawn of the Atomic age; the destruction of Nagasaki, one of the few Christian cities in Japan on the 9th August, and a very different fire and light from the gas chambers and incinerators at Auschwitz and other Nazi death camps; then the glory of Mary assumed to heaven at the very moment of her death on 15th August and a different sort of glory on VP Day, concluding the conflict of WWII.

Where do we now see God's light in our lives full of sorrows and joys as they are? How can we hear Jesus and experience his divine light in a world of lights of quite a different kind? We are given a new commandment by God on the mountain; that we are to listen to and follow God's Beloved Son. How do we do this today in a world of good wheat mixed in with weeds and many other distractions and attractions? Can we stick to our convictions and consciences when faced with the cross as Edith Stein, Mary and Jesus himself did? We pray that God will help us to listen to the voice of God's beloved Son, so that one day we may merit to be co-heirs with him who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Asking that God will enlighten and guide us every day on the path of justice and peace.


Over recent months the Archbishop has met with Pastor's and Parish Council's of these communities with discussions around planning toward being a "community of communities". As such last weekend's announcement advised that the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), who were seeking a return to the Archdiocese, will be taking care of the parish communities of St Lucia, Toowong and Indooroopilly from 2024.

Fr Greg Jacobs SJ will be Parish Priest of St Lucia and Administrator of Toowong and Indooroopilly parishes. Assisting across the three communities will be Fr Paul Fyfe SJ as associate pastor and Fr Frank Brennan SJ with sacramental ministry on a part time basis. The priests will reside at St Lucia Community.

Fr Michael Grace (current administrator of Indooroopilly) will receive another appointment in the new year.

As Dean I welcome the return of the Jesuits to the Archdiocese and particularly to our Brisbane West Deanery. I look forward to working with the priests of the Society of Jesus and seek your prayers for them and our neighbour parishes as they move toward a "community of communities".
