### The Tastor's Ten....

The Gospel story is about a sly trick set to trap Jesus; Do we pay taxes to Caesar or not? The reflection that follows shows how this trap was set and how Jesus didn't fall for it. Moreover, faced with the two parties/groups out to get him, the Pharisees and the Herodians, Jesus goes on to point out to both of them and to us, his followers, that money and wealth is meant to be at our service and that of the community.

Jesus says that what overrides this and should be of deeper concern to us is that we give to God what belongs to God. Sometimes this will be gifts from our wealth and material possessions, gifts of out time and talents, and ultimately the gift of ourselves and our allegiance to God through our faith in Jesus, his Good News and way of living in love and service to all, especially those in need.

Each and every one of us has to work out how we can make these essential gifts to God, serving within both the Church community and out in the big, wide world. This weekend's Annual Catholic Mission Appeal effectively draws our attention precisely to this question; How can I use my gifts to serve my sisters and brothers and those who go far from our shores to minister to them? Please be generous.

Now, to the promised reflection on the Gospel text.

In today's Gospel Jesus and the religious leaders in Jerusalem continue their tense exchange of questions and challenges. At this point the disciples of the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes.

Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favoured the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

Jesus' response to this attempt to trap him exposes the guile of his questioners. From his first words to them, Jesus shows that he is very much aware of what they are trying to do. He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. It may have come from the hand of a Herodian, but the Pharisees show themselves to be quite willing to accept this compromise. Jesus has already exposed the Pharisees as hypocrites.

Jesus takes his response one step further. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether, Jesus answers their question with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Jesus' response to the Herodians and Pharisees suggests the ethic that Christians ought to adopt. It reminds us of the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honour that we owe to God?

Photographs. You are invited to bring photographs of your deceased loved ones to the All Souls Parish Memorial Mass and place them on the table near the Baptismal font before Mass.


The Book of Life will be available in both churches throughout the month of November. Please write the names of your deceased loved ones into the Book of Life and all will be remembered and prayed for throughout November.

**Envelopes for Mass Offerings** can be collected from the entrances of the churches. You may place the names of your deceased loved ones on the back of the envelope (or on a list inside) along with your offering. Father Mark will record these names for the offering of Masses. This envelope is to be placed in the normal collection basket at Mass, or given directly to Father or handed into the Parish Office. Once the names on the envelopes have been recorded they will all be placed before the Altar at our churches throughout November.

Rosary: October is the month in which the Catholic Church particularly remembers the prayer of the rosary. As we have refreshed our understanding of the various mysteries over the month, the Luminous Mysteries, or the Mysteries of Light are highlighted this week. These were promulgated by Saint John Paul II in October 2002. These mysteries ponder the life and ministry of Jesus. They are well grounded in the Gospel story, and focus on the public ministry of Jesus. These mysteries have been designated to be prayed on Thursday. They complete the Gospel story of the birth, life, passion and resurrection of Jesus:

The Mysteries of Light: Thursdays: Pope John Paul II added The Mysteries of Light, also known as the Luminous Mysteries, in 2002:

- The Baptism in the River Jordan The voice of the Father declares Jesus the beloved Son (Matthew 3:13–16);
- The Wedding Feast at Cana Christ changes water into wine, his first public miracle (John 2:1–11);
- The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God Jesus calls to conversion and forgives the sins of all who draw near to him (Mark1:14–15);
- The Transfiguration The glory of the Godhead shines forth from the face of Christ (Matthew 17:1–8);
- The Institution of the Holy Eucharist Jesus at the Last Supper with his apostles establishes the sacramental foundation of the Eucharist (Matthew 26).
