The Tastor's Ten....

In this week's Gospel, Jesus talks about what it means to be prepared to receive the Kingdom of Heaven. The Gospel text follows a series of warnings and predictions by Jesus about the coming of the Son of Man. Jesus wants his disciples to understand that the exact day and time cannot be predicted. He teaches the disciples that they must remain vigilant so that they will not be caught unprepared.

When thinking about the parable of the wise and foolish virgins, it is important for us to consider the first-century wedding traditions of Palestine. Scholars tell us that it was the custom of the day for young maidens - friends and family members of the bride - to meet the bridegroom when he came to bring his bride to her new home.

As with many of Jesus' parables, several levels of interpretation are possible. In last week's Gospel we heard Jesus warn against following the example of the Pharisees and scribes. If read in the context of early Christianity's struggle to define itself against Pharisaic Judaism, this parable is a continuing critique of Judaism. It suggests that the Jewish leaders were like the foolish virgins, unprepared to meet and welcome Jesus, the bridegroom of Israel.

In the chapter the text preceding this parable, however, Jesus warns about the future destruction of Jerusalem, the tribulation of the end times, and the coming of the Son of Man. When read in this context, this parable is a warning to the Christian community to remain vigilant and prepared to receive Jesus, the Son of Man who will return at the end of time. This interpretation is supported by the reference to the delay of the bridegroom. The Christian community for whom Matthew wrote this Gospel was coming to terms with the realisation that the promise of Jesus' return would not be fulfilled in their lifetimes.

This weekend also begins on the Saturday evening of Remembrance Day. War and conflict continues apace in our world. People right now are facing death and suffering and many, be they warriors or civilians, men, women and children, are dying and having to face their God in whatever way they conceive God. Jesus' words about not knowing exactly when the Son of Man will come and being ready to meet and greet him with lamps alight has this relevance, too. The question remains for us to ask ourselves, 'Are we ready to receive Jesus?'. Will we be prepared to receive him whenever and however he comes?






Parish Liturgy Team Report: The Parish Liturgy Team met on Saturday 4 November. Key discussion items at the meeting were:

- Review of the recent Parish Memorial Mass and other parish celebrations and activities.
- Planning for upcoming liturgies, especially the Season of Advent and Christmas liturgies.
- Reporting on the various liturgical ministries and new volunteers joining the liturgical ministries.
- Tabling and discussion of the report prepared on the investigation into the feasibility of introducing digital screens in the churches and the recommendation not to proceed at this stage. The recommendation was accepted and endorsed by Fr Mark.

Break Open the Word: Copies are now available for the new liturgical year which commences on the First Sunday of Advent (2nd / 3rd December). Ministers of the Word please collect your copy located near the picture of Mary MacKillop in each church or from the Parish office during the week. This book is essential for the preparation of Ministers of the Word. Please purchase a copy, at the subsidised price of \$10.00 (Retail price is \$26). Previous editions of Break Open the Word can be donated to Prison Ministry via the parish office.





Advent Reflection Book - available from next weekend at the Churches or from the Parish Office. Advent is such a busy time of year and we so easily forget that - at its heart - it is meant to be a time of preparation, waiting and hope for the coming of Jesus into our world and lives.

To remind us of this, the parish has purchased "The Sign" a daily reflection book for Advent and the Christmas Season, which provides an opportunity for us to be still each day, listen to God, and come to know that Jesus is the whole reason for our being. Like Mary proclaimed in her Magnificat: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord." The Advent Program is a pocket-sized book that includes daily reflections from the beginning of Advent to the Baptism of the Lord. The book also includes beautiful artwork from the Masters with accompanying artwork reflections.

The Advent books will be available in both churches and at the parish from next weekend. A donation of \$5.00 per book would be appreciated to cover the costs the parish has expended. This donation can be placed in the normal parish collection at Mass, or use the Tap and Pay terminals at the doors of the churches, or pop into the parish office.

The Book of Life is displayed in both churches beside the Baptismal Font and Paschal Candle, connecting the Baptism of our loved ones into the eternal Light of Christ in new life. You are invited to write the names of your deceased loved ones, family and friends, into the Book of Life and all will be remembered and prayed for throughout November.

Envelopes for Mass Offerings can be collected from the entrances of the churches. You may place the names of your deceased loved ones on the back of the envelope (or on a list inside) along with your offering. This envelope is to be placed in the normal <u>collection basket at Mass, or given directly to Father or handed into the Parish Office</u>. Father Mark will record these names for the offering of Masses. Once the names on the envelopes have been recorded they will all be placed before the Altar at our churches throughout November. Please DO NOT place your envelope directly into the basket in front of the Altar.





Support you Parish by using the Tap & Pay Terminals: which are located at the main entrances of both churches. The screens display four donation options: \$5, \$10, \$20 or 'other amount'. Simply touch the amount you wish to offer and the screen will prompt you to tap your card for that chosen amount and it will show that your transaction has been successful. If you touch 'other amount' the screen will prompt you to type in the amount you wish to donate and then you simply tap your card when the screen is ready.

Parish Columbarium

Our parish columbarium has been embraced and used by so many parish families, since it was first built in 2004. It is a sacred place, next to St Joseph's Church, and is a most important part of our parish community and parish complex. Even though at a glance there appears to be many unused niches, most niches in the original two walls have been purchased and reserved by parishioners.

To address the need for more space, two new columbarium walls were constructed in recent years for the use of parish families. Niches in the newly constructed columbarium can be purchased at \$750 per single niche.

Some spaces remain available in the lowest row of the original columbarium walls. These single niches can be purchased at their original price of \$550 per niche.

Spaces for small plaques in memory of loved ones whose remains are located elsewhere, are also available. These small spots, for memorial plaques only, are available at a cost of \$250 each.

If you wish to enquire about purchasing a niche in the parish columbarium for yourself or your loved ones, please contact Michael at the parish office.
