The Pastor's Ten....

We bid a farewell to St. Matthew today as we begin a new year for our Church community guided by St. Mark's Gospel with St. John's Gospel (particularly his Chapter 6) playing a supporting role. This is because St. Mark's Gospel, the first to be written around 66-70AD, is short at just sixteen chapters and we have some thirty-three weeks of Ordinary Time to cover, to say nothing of the other weeks and seasons of our year.

The tone of Advent is one of hopeful expectation, praying and waiting for the celebration of the incarnation of God with us as one of us at Christmas and the weeks of the Christmas Season that follow. This Season ends with the Baptism of the Lord on Monday 8th January as Ordinary time commences.

This year's Advent Season is short at just twenty-two days and four weekends. The time for Ordinary Sundays before the Lenten Season is brief, too, only five full weeks before Ash Wednesday on the 14th February. This means an early Easter date with Easter Sunday in 2024 being celebrated on 31st March.

All of this is simply because of the fixed date of Christmas and the 'mysteries' of the secular and religious calendars, making it appear somewhat rushed. We are not to rush through any of this however, choosing rather to go day by day and step by step together doing as Jesus asks; staying alert and awake to God moving and working among us.

If I can suggest something to you for Advent it is to ask you to pay great attention to the Sunday First Readings which are drawn from the Prophet Isaiah and on the Fourth Advent Sunday from the Second Book of Samuel. The hopes and promises heard in these words point to the incarnate birth of Jesus and the beginning of God's Kingdom in our world.

With so much war, darkness and anxiety in our daily news feed, holy, God given visions of a better world and assurances of hope, renewal and salvation are very much needed. They will help to so balance our concerns with God's comfort, our worries with Divine witness and our fears with God's fidelity to us and to our world until the end of time.

We are companions of the journey, breaking bread and sharing life in Jesus Christ.

Advent Reflection Book - available at doors of the Churches or from the Parish Office. Advent is such a busy time of year and we so easily forget that - at its heart - it is meant to be a time of preparation, waiting and hope for the coming of Jesus into our world and lives.

To remind us of this, the parish has purchased "The Sign" a daily reflection book for Advent and the Christmas Season, which provides an opportunity for us to be still each day, listen to God, and come to know that Jesus is the whole reason for our being. Like Mary proclaimed in her Magnificat: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord." The Advent Program is a pocket-sized book that includes daily reflections from the beginning of Advent to the Baptism of the Lord. The book also includes beautiful artwork from the Masters with accompanying artwork reflections.

The Advent books are available at the doors of both churches and at the parish office. A donation of \$5.00 per book would be appreciated to cover the costs the parish has expended. This donation can be placed in the normal parish collection at Mass, or use the Tap and Pay terminals at the doors of the churches, or pop into the parish office.

Break Open the Word: Copies are available for the new liturgical year which commences this weekend on the First Sunday of Advent. 

in what I have done and in what I have failed to do,


[And, striking their breast, they say:] through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault;
