The Tastor's Ten....

This Sunday John the Baptist's witness, as recorded in John's Gospel, again holds centre stage. With some small differences the message is very like what we heard last weekend in Mark's Gospel. John comes into the desert wilderness near the Jordan River, calling for repentance and offering people a baptism of cleansing and recommitment. He prepares the way of our minds and hearts for the Greater One who is coming soon to rebirth us in God's Spirit. The First Reading from Isaiah, full of hope and promise, is one that Jesus will later on choose for and about himself at Nazareth when he begins his own ministry.

The following weekend and Fourth Sunday of Advent, a short weekend which then flows that Sunday afternoon and Monday morning into Christmas, puts our attention onto Mary. We will hear the story of her annunciation by the Angel Gabriel, her yes to what God was asking and the commencement of the Incarnation in Jesus' conception. The Greater One, whose way John would prepare for about thirty years later, began in Mary's willing welcome to what God wanted.

All of this means that this year we now have just seven days left of the Advent Season before Christmas is upon us. This will likely be a busy week for most of us; staying local or travelling away to family and friends; preparing for guests and meals or doing last minute shopping and packing up. In the midst of whatever this week holds for you try your best to remember the ministry of John the Baptist and the witness of Mary of Nazareth. Doing so will help keep the reason for this season front and centre in your minds and hearts.

Until next weekend and then the Christmas Feast recall Gabriel's words; Mary, Rejoice and do not be afraid. You have won God's favour. Listen now to what God Fr. Mark Percival. MA, PP. has to say.....

[And, striking their breast, they say:] through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault;


[Then they continue:]

"YOUR LIGHT WILL COME, JERUSALEM"


Your light will come, Jerusalem; Refrain: for on you will dawn the glory of the Lord, and all nations will walk in your light,
