The Fastor's Ten....

This is our fifth Sunday of listening to Mark's Gospel and we've finally reached the end of Chapter 1 only just in time for the beginning of Lent, with our Parish Ash Wednesday Masses and Liturgy this coming Tuesday evening 13th February and Wednesday morning 14th February.

In the Season of Lent we'll hear more of Mark's story of Jesus including his temptations in the wilderness after his baptism by John and his transfiguration on the mountain. Then, on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Lenten Sundays we'll be listening to sections of John's Gospel, returning to Mark for Palm / Passion Sunday and the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday.

This weekend's story is of the cleansing and healing of a person with leprosy, a man exiled from the community and from family and friends because of the dread and fear that surrounded this disease. In some places and countries leprosy is still seen as a contagion and reason for isolation from others. In fact, until relatively recent times, this was the case everywhere, including here in Australia.

The man breaks the rules of his time and culture, which are laid out in the First Reading, by coming close to Jesus and speaking to him, asking for help, saying; 'If you want to you can cure me'. St. Mark notes for us Jesus' immediate compassionate response and that Jesus instinctively reached out and touched the leprous man saying; 'Of course I want to. Be cured!'.



Knowing that he had touched the man and was therefore now considered potentially contaminated Jesus asked him to not tell anyone about what he had done. He ordered the man to have his cure confirmed by the Temple Priests so that he could re-enter the community and his life, but to not divulge details of how his healing happened.

Unfortunately the man couldn't contain his joy so he told his story far and wide. This led Jesus to have to spend time in isolation until people were sure that he wasn't infected. Jesus became a suspected leper, bearing this pain so that the man himself could be free. It doesn't take much to grasp that this was a 'cross' in Jesus' life, one which prefigures more to come and the great Cross itself on Good Friday when he takes on our sins and brokenness so that we might be healed and reconciled to God and each other. In other words, this healing leads to a miniature 'good friday' experience for Jesus and for the man.

St. Paul's text from his First Letter to the Corinthians tells us to do everything for the greater glory of God. This is a wonderful and a high standard to which we are being called. That we fail in this doesn't negate the rightness of the call itself. Rather, our failures must throw us back onto the compassion and mercy of God and into the healing arms of Jesus, time and time again. For as Paul knew and as we've got to learn over and over again, it's Jesus who makes us whole and holy, by the grace and free gift of God's redeeming love.

Prayer over the offering. May this oblation, O Lord, we pray, cleanse and renew us and may it become for those who do your will the source of eternal reward. Through Christ our Lord.


