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The Tastor's Ten....

On the second Sunday of Lent in each Lectionary cycle, the Gospel reading proclaims the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. This event is reported in each of the Synoptic Gospels - Matthew, Mark, and Luke. This year, in Lectionary Cycle B, we hear Mark's report of this event. Continuing my Lenten focus on prayer and praying, this Gospel story is rich with insight for us.

The context for Mark's Transfiguration story is similar to that found in both Matthew's and Luke's Gospel as they base their story on that of Mark. The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his coming passion. After this, in each of these Gospels, there is also a discussion of the cost of discipleship.

In each case, Jesus takes three of his disciples - Peter, James, and John - to a high mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus. In Matthew's and Mark's Gospels, there is reference to a conversation among Jesus, Elijah, and Moses, but only Luke includes the detail that this conversation is about what Jesus' passing will accomplish in Jerusalem.

Elijah and Moses are significant figures in the history of Israel. Moses led the Israelites from slavery in Egypt and received the Ten Commandments from God. In appearing with Jesus at his Transfiguration, Moses represents the Law that guides the lives of the Jewish people. Elijah is remembered as one of the most important prophets of Israel who helped the Israelites stay faithful to God. Some Jews believed that Elijah's return would signal the coming of the Messiah for the Jewish people. The appearance of these two important figures from Israel's history with Jesus signifies Jesus' continuity with the Law and with the Prophetic promises. It also tells us that Jesus is the fulfilment of all that God promised to the people of Israel.

On seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Mark reports that the disciples are terrified by what they have witnessed and that Peter's offer is made out of confusion. We also notice that Peter has reverted from his earlier confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus rabbi/teacher instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding the disciples to listen obediently to him. This voice from heaven recalls and amplifies the Divine voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructs the disciples to keep secret what they have seen until after the Son of Man has risen from the dead. The disciples' confusion continues as they wonder what Jesus means by rising from the dead. The disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration until they also witness his passion and death. We hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection, even as we prepare to remember Jesus' passion and death. The Prayer after Communion at Mass places our discipleship with that of those who witnessed Jesus Transfiguration:

As we receive these glorious mysteries, (in the Eucharist) we make thanksgiving to you, O Lord, for allowing us while still here on earth to be partakers even now of the things of heaven. Through Christ our Lord.

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM



The 2024-26 Sacraments of Initiation program run by the Catholic Parish of Corinda Graceville – is for all children who are baptised and will have turned 8 years of age by July 1, 2024, (usually Grade 3 children and above), regardless of which school they attend.

The premise under which this policy is implemented within our Parish, is about inviting children to complete their initiation into the Catholic faith as part of a parish based, school supported, family centred preparation program. We will be working together as a team to continue your child's faith journey.

An information night will be held at **6:30pm** on **Thursday 14th March 2024**, at **Christ the King Church**, Churchill Street, Graceville, **for parents and children who would like to find out more about the program** - Confirmation, Holy Communion and Penance - and the process for enrolling their child/children in the same. Important information regarding the program will be provided at this night, so at least one parent or guardian should attend so that you may be in the best possible position to make an informed decision on whether your family wish to commit to the program at this time. Children are encouraged to also attend so that they can check out the Catechesis Atrium that they will be attending.

We look forward to journeying alongside you all during this special season of preparation.
