The Fastor's Fen....

Mark's Gospel is short, so for this and the following two weekends of Lent we'll be hearing from St. John's Gospel. As a reminder, my focus with you during Lent this year is on prayer, praying and living prayerfully. So, a reflection on the dramatic and powerful Gospel text for this weekend follows.

In this Gospel text we read about how Jesus overturned the tables of the merchants and the moneychangers in the Temple at Jerusalem. In order to understand the relevance of Jesus' action, we have to know about the activities that were going on in the temple area in Jesus' time. Worship at the Temple in Jerusalem included animal sacrifices, and merchants sold animals to worshipers. Moneychangers exchanged Roman coins which bore the image of the Roman emperor and which were banned from the Jerusalem Temple precinct, for the temple coins (no Emperor's image on these) that were needed to pay the temple tax. These merchants also greatly overcharged the worshippers who were a 'captive market' in the Temple forecourts.

Jesus' action at the Temple is recorded in all four Gospels and is understood to be among the key events that would lead to Jesus' arrest and Crucifixion. John's Gospel places this event much earlier in Jesus' public ministry than do the Synoptic Gospels. In John's story it happens at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry, after his first miracle at the wedding feast at Cana.

We need read John's Gospel carefully, especially in its presentation of Jesus' relationship to Judaism. St. John tends to reflect greater tension and animosity between Jesus and the Jewish authorities than do the Synoptic Gospels. John's was the last of the four Gospels to be written and its narrative reflects the growing divide between the Jewish community and the early Christian community with greater emphasis on the distinction between Christianity and Judaism. Reflecting upon the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem (A.D. 70), John recalls Jesus' cleansing of the Temple, using that story to interpret this later event. John explained to his early Christian community and audience that temple worship was no longer necessary because it had been surpassed in the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus.

After clearing the Temple of the merchants and the moneychangers, John tells us that the leaders of the people asked for a sign of Jesus' authority to do such an audacious act. In response, Jesus predicted his death and Resurrection, a new, lasting Temple in himself. Throughout John's Gospel, the language of signs is distinctive. Jesus' miracles are called signs, and the people look to these signs for proof of his authority. Here we learn that the sign par excellence will be Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection.

During the Lenten Season we reflect upon the meaning of this sign for us and for our world, a sign given that we will soon commemorate in Holy Week. Let's take this opportunity to deeply consider the quality of our prayer and worship. In our personal and group prayers we seek to deepen our relationship with the person of Christ. In our worship as a Parish community we gather to experience anew the Passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus and its significance in our lives. Christ promises to be present with us when we gather for prayer. May we never forget his promise!

Sacraments of Initiation Info Night for Confirmation, Holy Communion and Penance

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM

The 2024-26 Sacraments of Initiation program run by the Catholic Parish of Corinda Graceville – is for all children who are baptised and will have turned 8 years of age by July 1, 2024, (usually Grade 3 children and above), regardless of which school they attend.

The premise under which this policy is implemented within our Parish, is about inviting children to complete their initiation into the Catholic faith as part of a parish based, school supported, family centred preparation program. <u>We will be working</u> together as a team to continue your child's faith journey.

An information night will be held at 6:30pm on Thursday 14th March 2024, at Christ the King Church, Churchill Street, Graceville, for parents and children who would like to find out more about the program - Confirmation, Holy Communion and Penance - and the process for enrolling their child/children in the same. Important information regarding the program will be provided at this night, so at least one parent or guardian should attend so that you may be in the best possible position to make an informed decision on whether your family wish to commit to the program at this time. Children are encouraged to also attend so that they can check out the Catechesis Atrium that they will be attending.

We look forward to journeying alongside you all during this special season of preparation.

Samoa may be a country surrounded by water, but access to clean drinking water is scarce in some areas, with many families facing extreme hardship as a result.

Leaia lives with her five children, husband, brother and sister-in-law on the island of Upolu in Samoa. Not having access to a reliable source of clean water caused Leaia a lot of worry.

Their home is not connected to a piped water system, so they had to rely solely on rainwater collected in old fridges. When their water ran out, Leaia had to walk with her young children to collect water in buckets and containers from a neighbour down the street.

With the support of Caritas Australia's local partner, Caritas Samoa, a water tank was installed at Leaia's home. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water at home. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

"We are very thankful and grateful for the water tank. It has helped us so much and made our daily life easier," Leaia said.



"Eat whatever you want for Lent, the sacrifice is not in the stomach, but in the heart." People can refrain from eating meat, but don't talk to their siblings or relatives, don't visit their parents or attend to their needs, don't share food with the needy, mothers forbid children to see their fathers, parents may forbid grandparents to see their grandchildren, people may criticize other people's lives, beat their wives. A good barbeque or beef stew won't make you a bad person, just like a fish fillet won't turn you into a saint. This Lent it is better to seek to have a deeper relationship with God through better treatment of others. Let's be less arrogant and more humble of heart.
